Many Clearcreek Township residents recently received a letter from Dynegy Energy Services related to their electric supply. This is a legitimate letter and is a program put in place by the Township. This process is called Aggregation and is governed by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio for local governments to pursue.

In November, the voters of Clearcreek Township approved the Township to become an Electric Aggregator. The Township subsequently followed the process required by the PUCO and got certified as an Electric Aggregator. The Township then came to agreement with Dynegy Electric Services to put in place a fixed rate of 5.39 cents per kWh for a three year term starting in August 2016. This 5.39 cents compares to the Duke Energy rate of 6.32 cents and DP&L rate of 7.28 cents per kWh. So Duke Energy customers are saving 15% and DP&L customers are saving 26% on their electric generation costs.

A few points to make clear:

- Rate is fixed at 5.39 cents per kWh (kilowatt hour).
- Term is 3 years starting with August 2016 meter reading.
- There is no fee or penalty if you wish to get out of the program at any time.
- This does not impact, affect, or change Duke Energy or DP&L from providing the same services to distribute, maintain, or respond to an emergency.
- This does not change your bill or anything regarding your bill other than seeing the Dynegy Energy Services name listed by your electric generation costs on your bill.
- This is an "opt-out" program that you need to take action if you don't want to participate.
- The Township will gather pricing and authorize a new rate and term at the end of the 3 years as long as it is better than what Duke Energy and DP&L offer as a regulated electric supply cost.
- The Township pursued this solely to save our residents money with a process, electric aggregation that could be put in place by the Township or the County with the power of group buying.
