On 5/1/22 @ 02:48 hours, Officer D. Williams checked on a suspicious vehicle in a parking lot on East State Route 73. Officer Williams identified the driver of the vehicle and found the driver appeared to have been drinking. Upon further investigation, the driver was arrested for OVI.

On 5/2/22 @ 00:29 hours, Officers Blaha, McWhorter, and Robinson responded to a call on Weidner Road that a pickup truck ran off the road, struck a utility pole causing several down power lines and a local power outage, then left the scene. Upon arrival, officers closed the roadway and spoke with witnesses. The truck and driver were located nearby and the driver was arrested for OVI, Reckless Operation, Failure to Control, and Fleeing the Scene.

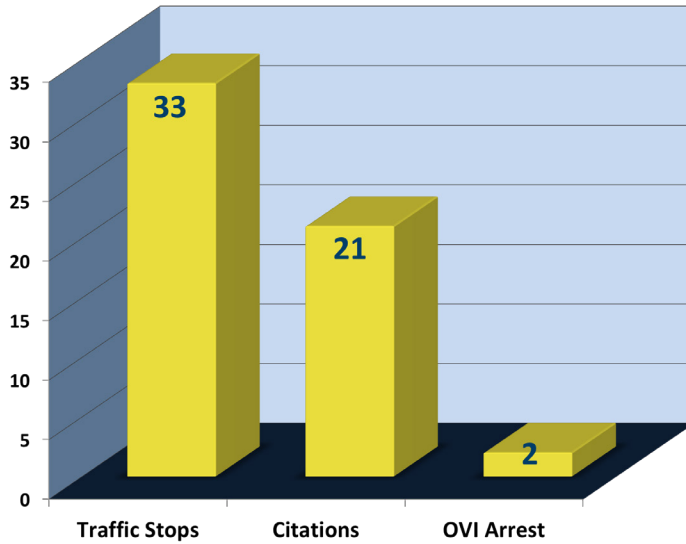
On 5/2/22 @ 11:27 hours, Officer Ney and Sergeant Bates responded to the Warren County Alternative School on a report that one student assaulted another student. Officers viewed video footage of the attack and the aggressor was arrested for Assault.

On 5/4/22 @ 00:23 hours, Officers Blaha and McWhorter responded to a Domestic Violence call on Whispering Stream Court. An adult was arrested for Domestic Violence and Aggravated Menacing.

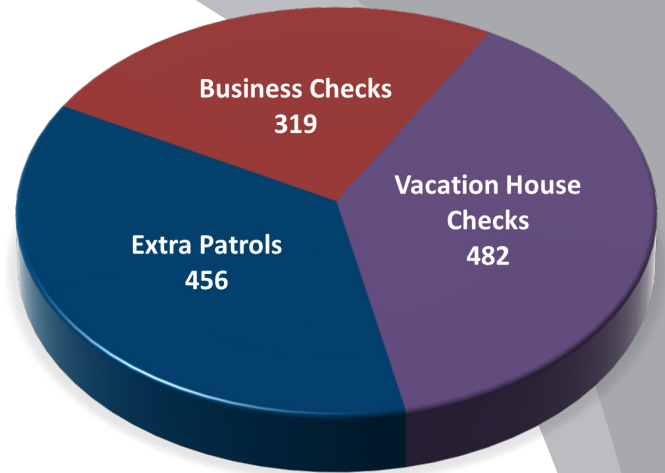
On 5/16/22 @ 09:19 hours, Officer Blaha was working a detail at the Warren County Alternative School, when a student became involved in a verbal altercation with a staff member. Officer Blaha entered the room where the altercation was occurring to see the student throw a desk toward the staff member. As Officer Blaha approached, the student threw another desk in her direction. When Officer Blaha attempted to arrest the student for Disorderly Conduct, the student assaulted her by shoving her. The student was subdued and charged with Disorderly Conduct, Assault, and Resisting Arrest.

On 5/25/22 @ 11:36 hours, Officer Ney was dispatched to a call of a black SUV on State Route 123 out of Franklin, driving without a tire on one rim and throwing sparks. Officer Ney located the vehicle and the driver on State Route 122 near Red Lion. While speaking with the driver, he received notification that the same vehicle was observed striking a mailbox on North State Route 123 and left the scene. After further investigation, the driver was cited for Driving Under Suspension, Failure to Stop after an Accident, and Failure to Control.

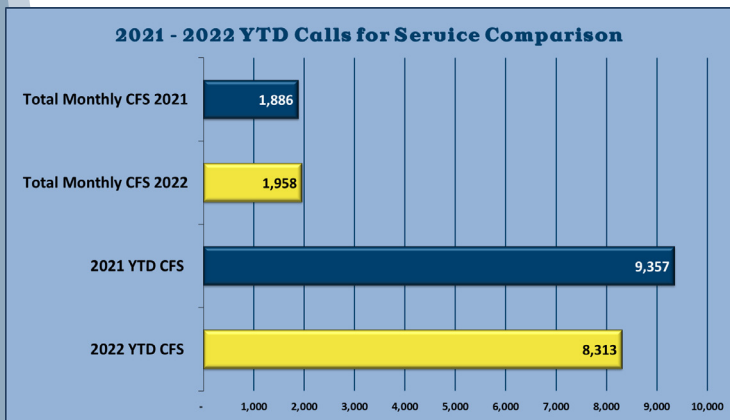

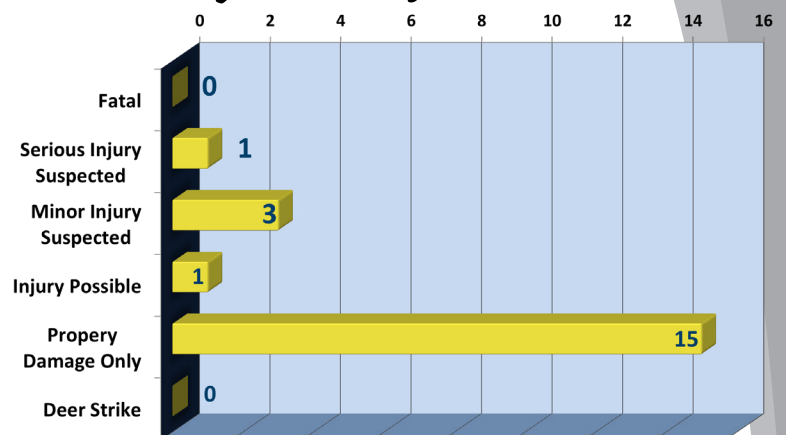
