On the Call

Significant Activity

On September 27, 2024, Corporal Knobbe and Officers Hall and Horwarth, responded to Game Day Bar and Grill, at 7576 N. St. Rt. 48, for a report of an unconscious male in a vehicle. Upon officer's arrival, the male was in his vehicle and not responding to officers. Upon arrival of Clearcreek Township Medics, the male was awakened and refused medical treatment. Upon further investigation, the male was charged with Having Physical Control of a Vehicle while under the influence.

On September 25, 2024, Corporal Blaha responded to a residence in the 1500 Block of Elm Brook Trail for a report of a stolen vehicle. The complainant told officers that she had gotten up for work that morning and noticed her vehicle was gone. Officers quickly obtained the needed information and entered the vehicle as stolen into the LEADS database. The vehicle was located later that day, by another police agency, and the vehicle was processed for DNA and Fingerprints. The vehicle was returned to the victim and the investigation is currently ongoing.

On September 18, 2024, Officer Bronnenberg was on routine patrol in the 7000 Block of Bunnell Hill Road, when he observed another vehicle cross the center line into the other lane of travel. The vehicle was stopped for the traffic violation and officers noticed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the female motorist. Upon further investigation, the female was charged with OVI and Driving in Marked Lanes. A breath test, provided by the female, indicated a .192 Blood Alcohol Level.

On September 16, 2024, Officer Robinson responded to a residence in the 7000 Block of Woodbridge Court for a report of a vehicle stolen from the complainant's driveway overnight. Officers quickly obtained the needed information and entered the vehicle as stolen into the LEADS database. On September 17, 2024, The City of Dayton Police Department found the stolen vehicle and the vehicle was brought to the Clearcreek Township Police Department for evidence processing. The vehicle was returned to the victim and the investigation is currently ongoing.

On September 13, 2024, Sergeant Bates and Corporal Blaha responded to a residence in the 100 Block of Diamond Drive for an active stolen vehicle complaint where it was alleged the suspect brandished a handgun with another accomplice. While officers were on scene, they were notified by Warren County Dispatch that a City of Springboro Police Officer was behind a vehicle matching the description of the stolen vehicle on North St. Rt. 48. Clearcreek Township and City of Springboro Officers responded to North St Rt. 48 and attempted to initiate a traffic stop. The suspect vehicle, along with another vehicle that was later discovered to also be stolen, refused to stop and continued west on Social Row Road. When the vehicles reached the on ramp to northbound I-75, one of the vehicles crashed on the entrance ramp and the motorist fled on foot, crossing over I-75. Officers were able to detain the male juvenile motorist, and he was charged with Aggravated Robbery, Aggravated Burglary, Theft, Receiving Stolen Property, Failure To Comply with Order or Signal of a Police Officer, and other charges. The other vehicle in the pursuit was recovered by Springboro Police Officers, north of Warren County. Upon investigation by Detective Barton, a warrant has been issued for the arrest of the other motorist involved in the pursuit and robbery.

On September 6, 2024, Officer Schrage was on patrol in the area of Bennington Way and Hastings Court, due to a high number of stolen vehicles in Warren and Montgomery counties. Officer Schrage noticed a vehicle that was driving quickly, and erratically, through the subdivision. Officers attempted to stop the vehicle for investigation and the motorist refused to stop and sped away. Officers from the City of Springboro Police assisted with pursuing the vehicle into the City of Dayton, where City of Dayton Police Officer's assisted as well. The suspect vehicle attempted to take a curve too quickly in a neighborhood and crashed. Two males fled the vehicle on foot and officers pursued them on foot. Upon being able to run the license plate on the vehicle, it was found to had been stolen from Montgomery County. Officers were able to locate the male suspect a short time after the crash and he was charged with Failure to Comply with Order or Signal of a Police Officer, Receiving Stolen Property, Operating a Motor Vehicle without a Valid License, and Operation in Willful or Wanton Disregard of Safety. The investigation into the fleeing passenger of the vehicle is ongoing.

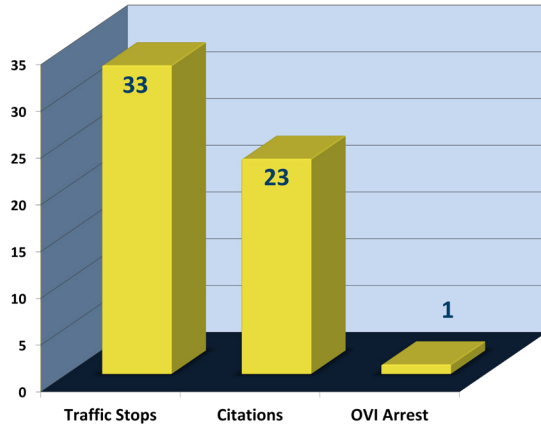


Excellence Through Training

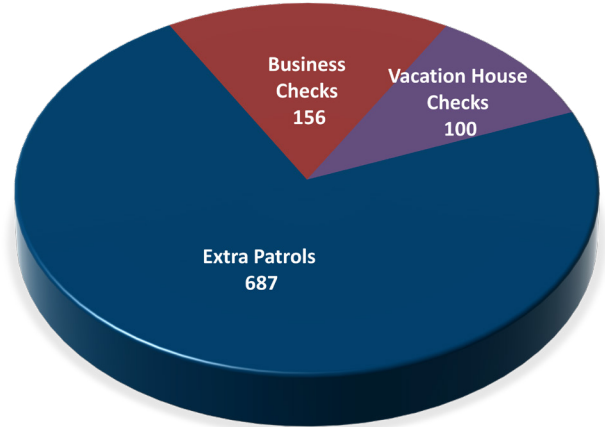
All officers worked on Crisis Mitigation (de-escalation) through Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy.

Officers also took part in our annual Defensive Tactics Training and our annual shotgun qualifications range.

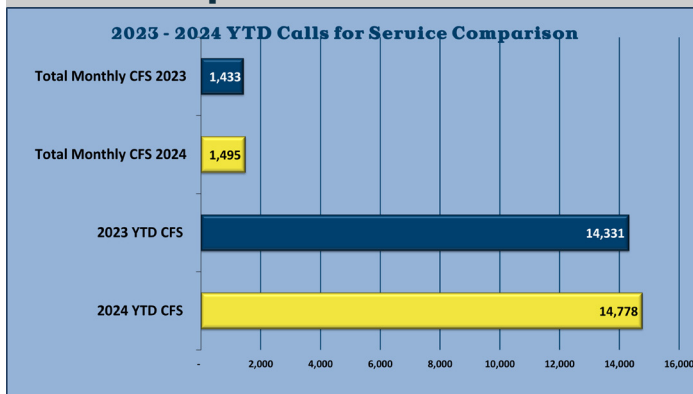

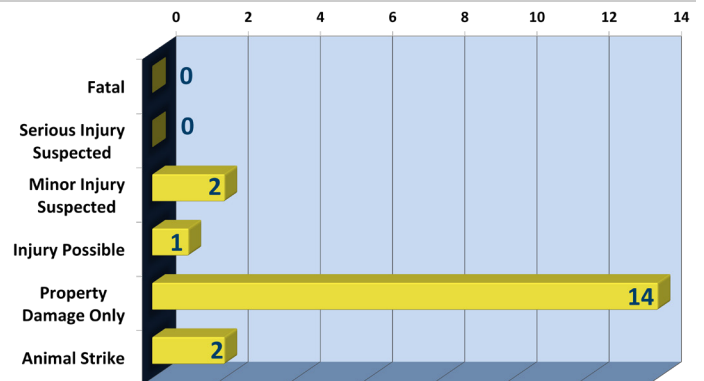

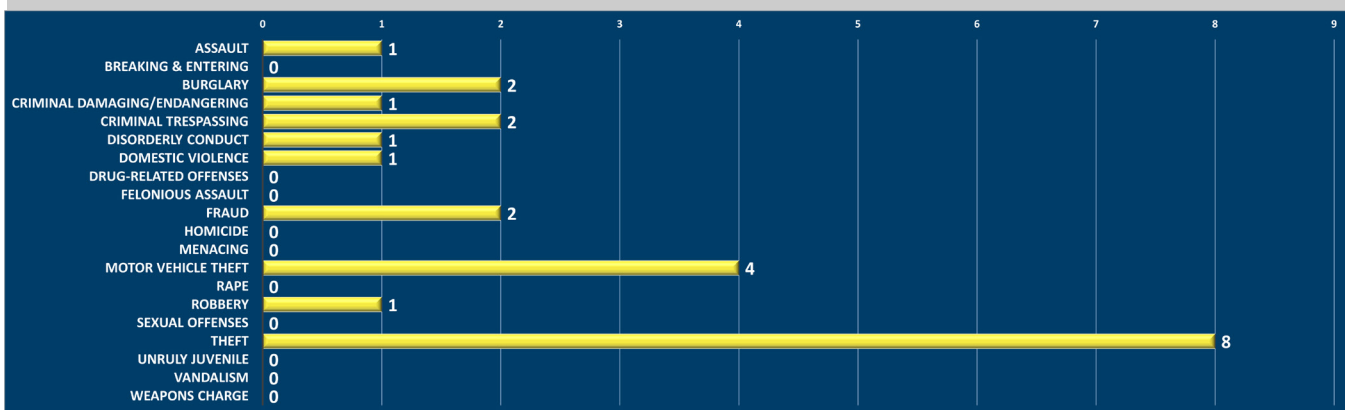
Calls for Service 2023 - 2024 YTD Comparison
