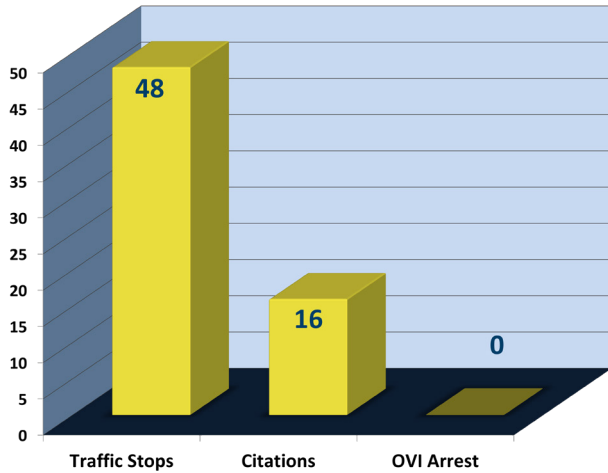
Significant Activity

On November 20, 2024, Officer Bronnenberg assisted the Waynesville Police Department with a male who had fled the scene of an incident. Officer Bronnenberg located the vehicle, in the area of US 42 and Quail Field Drive, and attempted to stop the vehicle. The vehicle failed to stop and fled north on Township Line Road. Deputies from the Warren County Sheriff's Office were able to successfully deploy stop sticks and bring the vehicle to a stop. The male driver was charged with Failure to Comply with a Lawful Police Order and additional charges from other agencies.

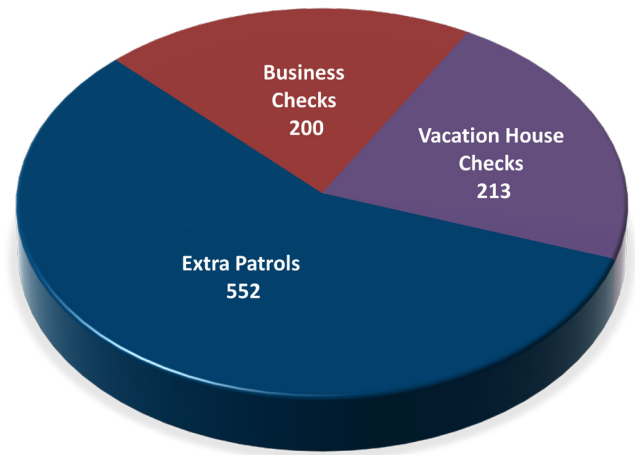
On November 6, 2024, Sergeant Bates and Officer Robinson were dispatched to the Warren County Alternative School for a report of a female student that had an active arrest warrant from Butler County. Officers located the juvenile and took her into custody. The juvenile was then turned over to the custody of the Butler County Sheriff's Office.

In November 2024, Officer's gave testimony in the Warren County Juvenile Court for a previous stolen vehicle case, when two juveniles stole a motor vehicle and produced a firearm when the victim attempted to intercede, then fled the scene while officers pursued. One of those juveniles was convicted of Aggravated Robbery, Aggravated Burglary, Burglary, Aggravated Theft, Receiving Stolen Property, Failure to Comply, Carrying a Concealed Weapon, and Improper Handling of a Firearm. The juvenile will be sentenced in Montgomery County Court. The other juvenile involved is currently awaiting trial.

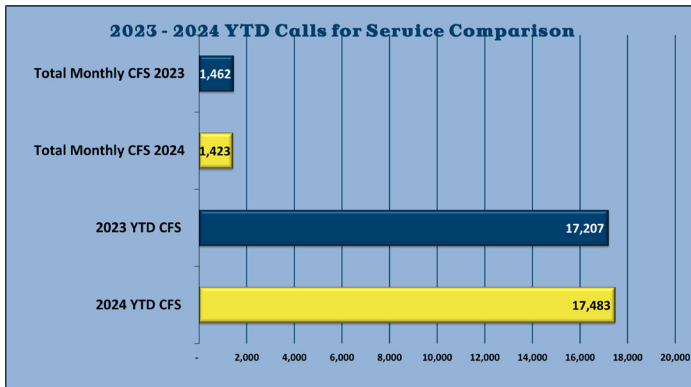

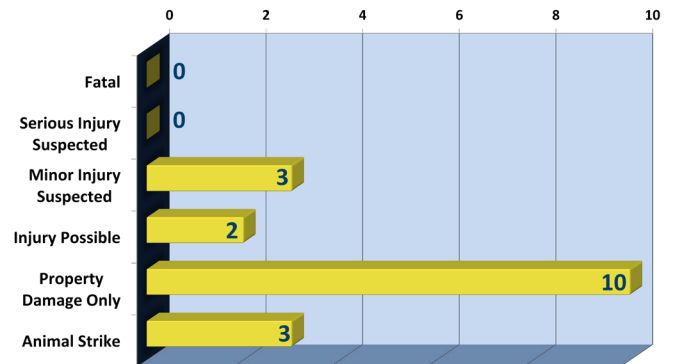

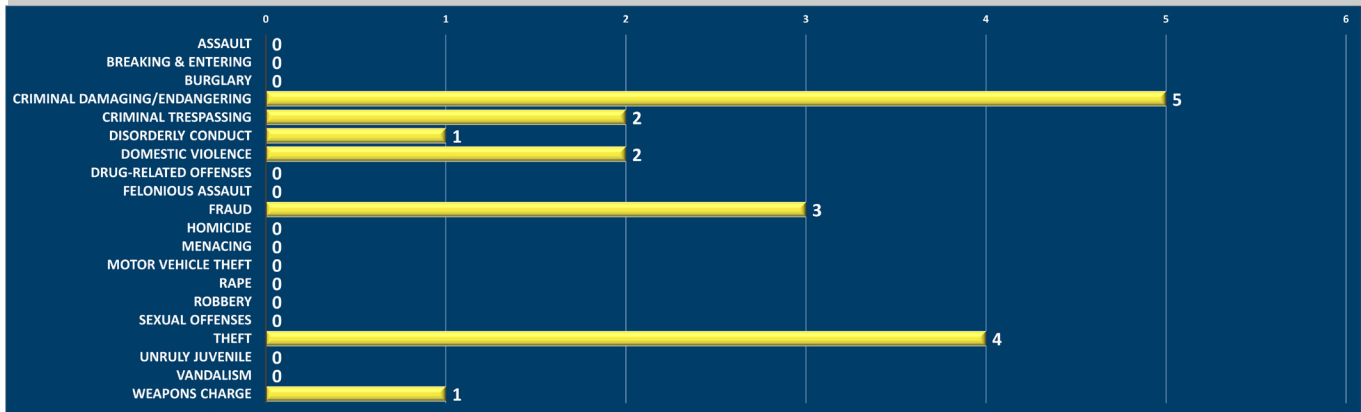
Calls for Service 2023 - 2024 YTD Comparison
