It has been reproduced in many ways by many Police Departments across the U.S. This program offers pedestrian safety and bicycle safety, crosswalks, traffic signals, hands-on activities with our "Safety Town Village", DNA swab kits, gun safety, using 911, dangers of parked cars, School bus safety and a visit to the Fire Station! ### On the Call

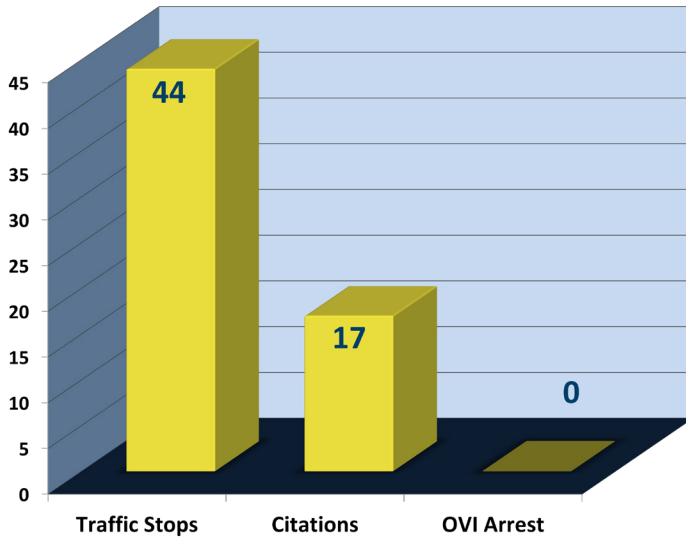
#### Significant Activity

On June 23, 2024, officers responded to a residence in the 5000 block of Weidner Road for a report of intoxicated subjects. Another female juvenile at the residence provided false information to officers and was also charged with underage consumption of alcohol and obstructing official business.

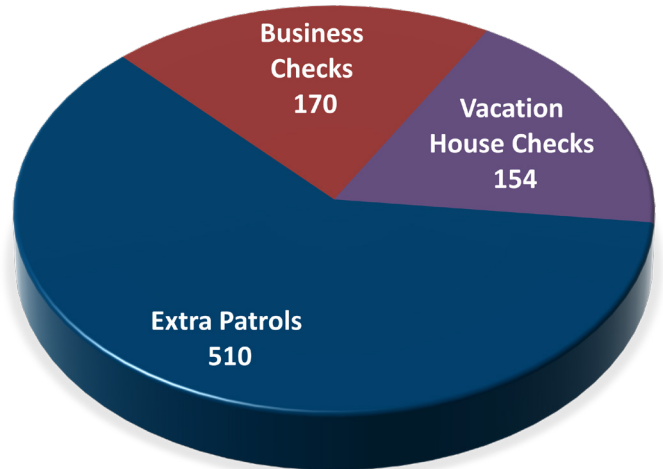

The female caller advised she was at her ex-husband's residence to retrieve belongings when the male got upset and pointed a firearm at her. Upon investigation, the male was arrested for domestic violence and aggravated menacing.

On June 6, 2024, officers responded to the 9500 block of North State Route 48 for a report of a motor vehicle crash. Upon investigation, officers discovered that one of the motorists involved in the crash had an active arrest warrant through the City of Carlisle, Warren County. The male was placed under arrest and was released to the custody of the City of Carlisle Police.

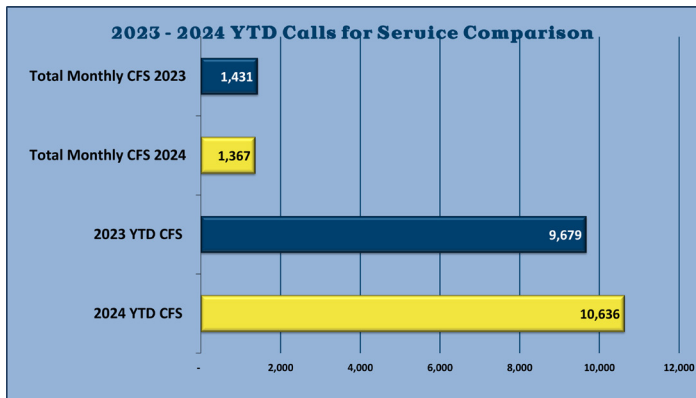

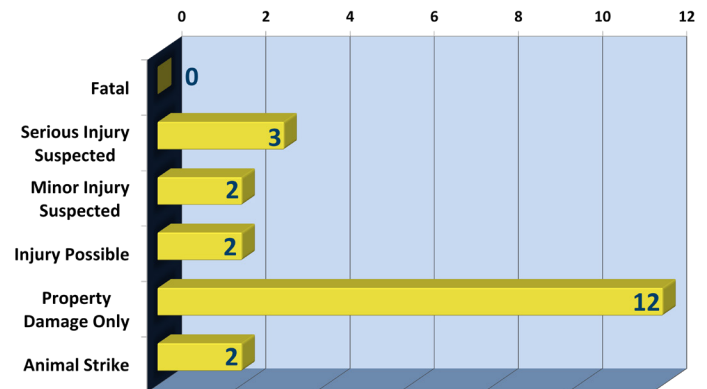

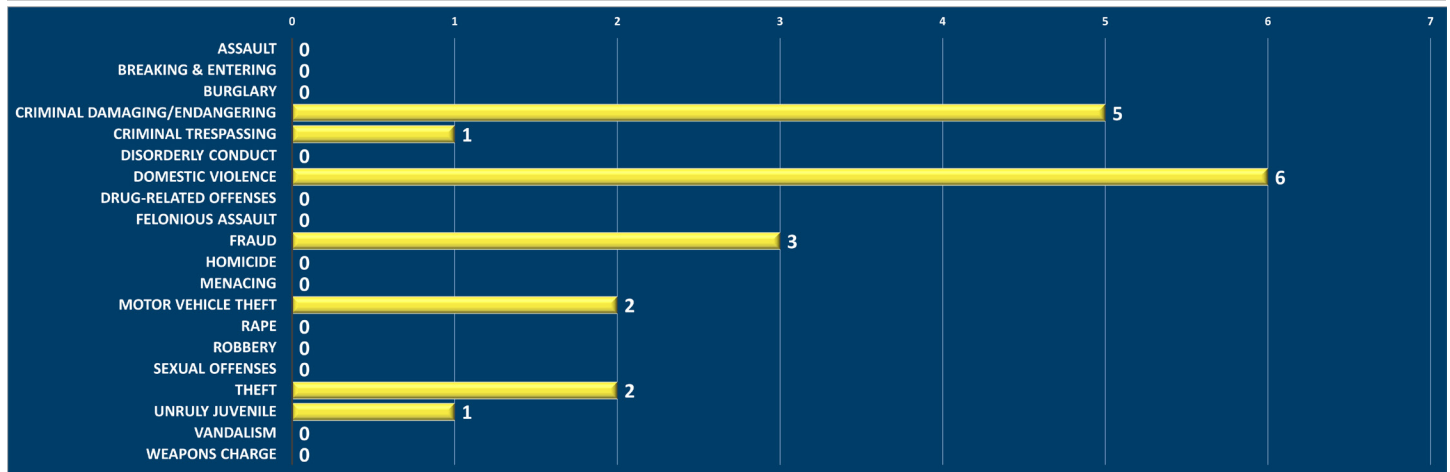
## Calls for Service 2023 - 2024 YTD Comparison
