

Throughout 2024, Road Maintenance crews completed several large projects. Beginning in April, they began preparing for a new salt bin. This work included demolishing the aging salt bin and raising the foundation site 17-ft for the 80-ft by 120-ft concrete pad. The new bin now houses 2,400 tons of salt.



At Patricia Allyn Park, crews extended the Pickleball courts to 10-ft by 100-ft. They also filled two ditches at the park, using catch basins and 480-ft of pipe. As construction finished on the new police station, crews transported the excavated soil from the site to the park for storage.

Notable roadwork included crack sealing all roadways in the Waynesboro subdivision, tree trimming on Red Lion Five Points Road, and clearing the corner of Crosley Road and Lyte Five Points Road to improve sight distance. Using 21,600 pounds of mastic patch, 11,793 tons of gravel, and 129 tons of asphalt, crews repaired 7.72 miles of roadway throughout the township. This includes micro sealing 1.62 miles, cap sealing 3.67 miles, and paving 2.43 miles. Crews also striped 5.9 miles of roadway.

Additionally, crews inventoried catch basins and all road signs, and graded streets for road service life throughout the township. The software logs GPS locations and catalogues information for repair and replacement. Road crews catalogued a total of 1,062 catch basins and 2,307 street signs.
