January 2025

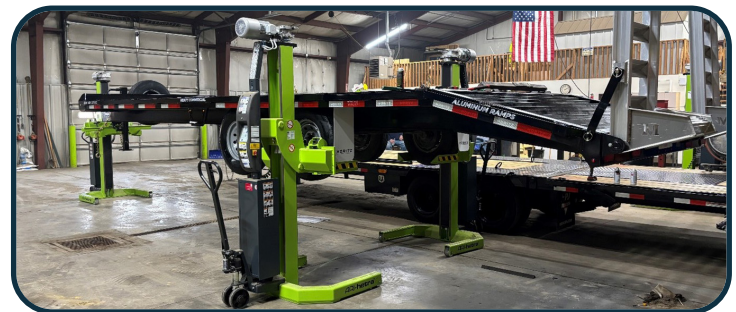
January started with a significant snowstorm, accumulating 9.5 inches of snow and temperatures below 20 degrees on the 5th and 6th. Operating ten plow trucks and one Bobcat with a push box, crews cleared 200 lane miles of roadway, cul-de-sacs, and the Government Center, Police, and Fire District parking lots. With all hands on deck for this storm, we are lucky to have the latest crewmember, Alex, on board. He proved his ability with the plow and was a tremendous help during the storm.



Another snowstorm kept crews busy on January 10th and 11th. This storm added 3.5 inches of snow and temperatures below 15 degrees. To maintain supplies, crews also took delivery of 800 tons of salt for storage.

Using the GPS IWorq software, crews measured and graded all guard rails within the township, a total of 4,144 feet of guard rails. This inventory provides an efficient way to schedule repairs and replacements.

Despite the multiple snowstorms, crews are already preparing for spring by cleaning and servicing all fleet trailers.



Closing out the month, the Road Maintenance Department received a new Freightliner M2 Dump Truck on January 31st. The builder displayed this addition to our fleet at the Ohio Township Association show during the last week of January.
