Station 24 Updates

In February, construction crews completed the south wall of the Apparatus Bay and began masonry work on the east side. They laid intermediate masonry walls, and the electrician continued conduit installation. After passing subgrade testing and inspection, crews prepared for the building slab pour. Additional accomplishments include plumbing installation for floor drains and the start of walls for the Training Tower. Crews finished the month by completing intermediate masonry walls on the south side of the dorms and a section of the east wall. Construction crews will begin working on light poles and the Training Tower in March. Overall, the work is progressing as planned.



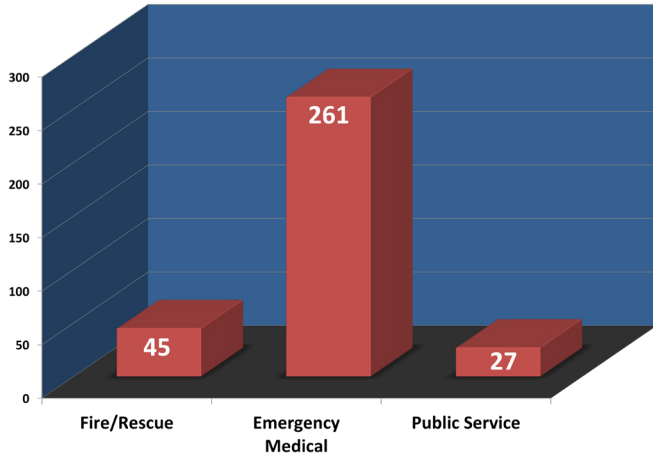

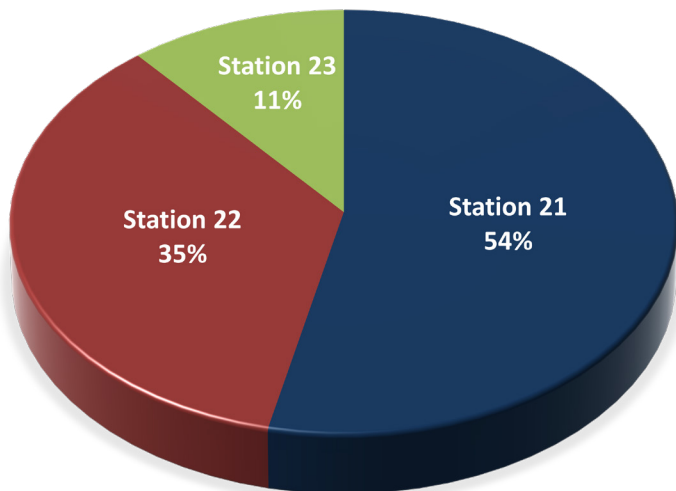
Alarms by Service Type

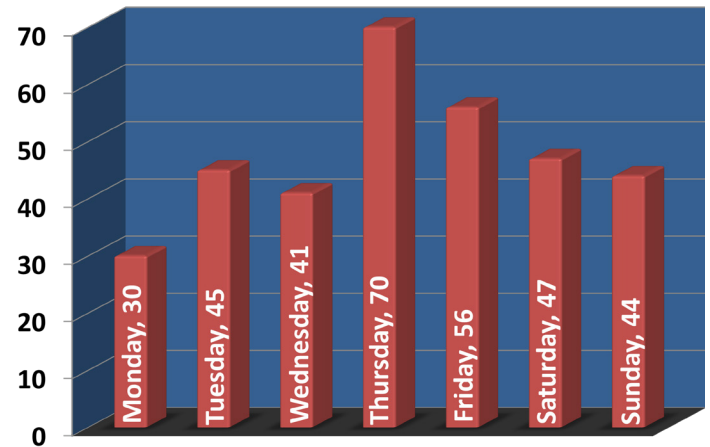
Response Percentages

Significant Responses

On 2/2/24 @ 17:52 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Waynesville for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with bystanders performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley Hospital South.

On 2/2/24 @ 20:26 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Franklin.

On 2/3/24 @ 11:08 hours, crews responded to West Central Avenue for a reported passenger vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a car with active fire in the engine compartment. Crews extinguished the fire using a bumper line from Rescue 21. Crews checked for extension and secured the site of hazards. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$3,000.

On 2/7/24 @ 09:35 hours, crews responded to Tahlequah Trail for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crew found a manufacturing facility with nothing showing. Investigation showed an audible alarm from inside the building and smoke haze. Further investigation showed a compartment in the HVAC unit had smoke damage but no active fire. Miami Valley Fire District provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$25,000.

On 2/8/24 @ 05:11 hours, crew responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with Springboro PD performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS Procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 2/8/24 @ 19:58 hours, crews responded to Bunnell Hill Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a vehicle rolled over, off-road with fire in the engine compartment and one confirmed entrapment. Crews extinguished the fire and extricated the patient, who was determined to be DOA. After securing the site of hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 2/9/24 @ 04:04 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Lebanon for a reported structure fire with entrapment. Upon arrival, crews found a residential working fire with Lebanon crews on-scene. Crews assisted with suppression and search efforts. Crews extracted one victim then returned to assist in extinguishing hot spots until released by command.



On 2/8/24 @ 11:31 hours, crews responded to West Central Avenue for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles involved in a crash. Crews transported two patients to Dayton Children's Hospital – South Campus, and one to Kettering Health Franklin. Crews cleared the site of hazards and released the scene to Springboro PD.





On 2/8/24 @ 23:59 hours, crews responded to Pekin Road for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residence with smoke coming from the garage. Investigation showed a working fire inside the garage. Crews extinguished the fire using a handline. Crews checked for extension and performed ventilation. Franklin Township provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$50,000.



On 2/11/24 @ 17:00 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with facility staff performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 2/11/24 @ 18:10 hours, crews responded to a residence for difficulty breathing. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 2/15/24 @ 14:25 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Turtlecreek Township for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews assisted in extricating the driver and transported one patient to Kettering Health Middletown.

On 2/15/24 @ 17:27 hours, crews responded to an apartment complex for a reported suicide. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews released the scene to the coroner and Springboro PD.

On 8/24/24 @ 22:58 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with Springboro PD performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 2/28/24 @ 12:17 hours, crews responded to an assisted living center for a reported sick person. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.
