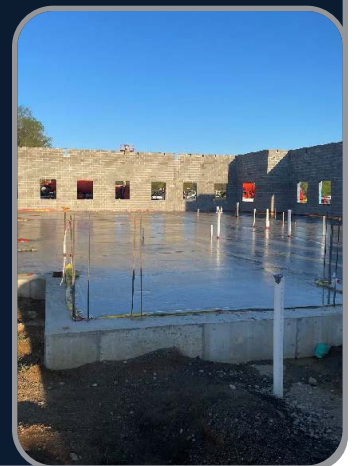
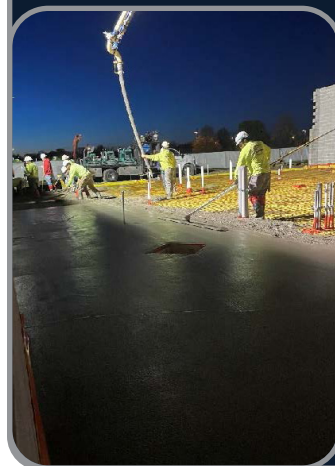

Station 24 Updates

Despite several rain events in early April, construction on Station 24 continues at a fast pace. Construction crews completed the storm shelter and base flashing around windows. As the month progressed, crews placed the on-grade slabs, and the curing process began. They continued installing the flashing angles around the windows. The slab pour took about five hours and used 42 trucks of concrete. This pour totaled 400 yards, with 1,000 yards projected by the project's end. In May, the builders plan to collaborate with trade contractors to increase the workforce to make up for weather delays and start roofing later in the month.



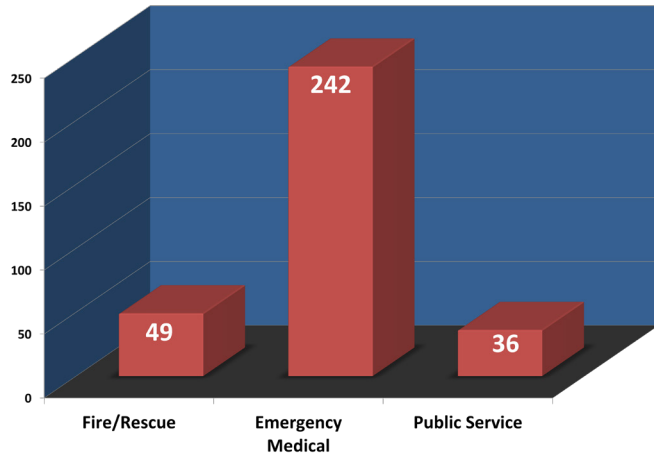


On the Call

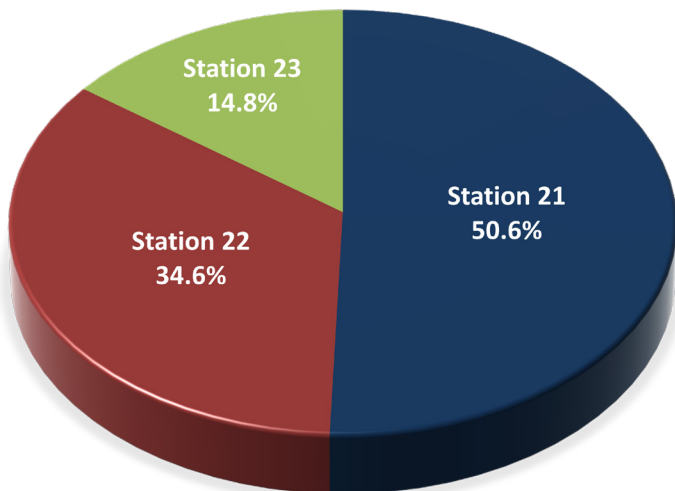
Alarms by Service Type

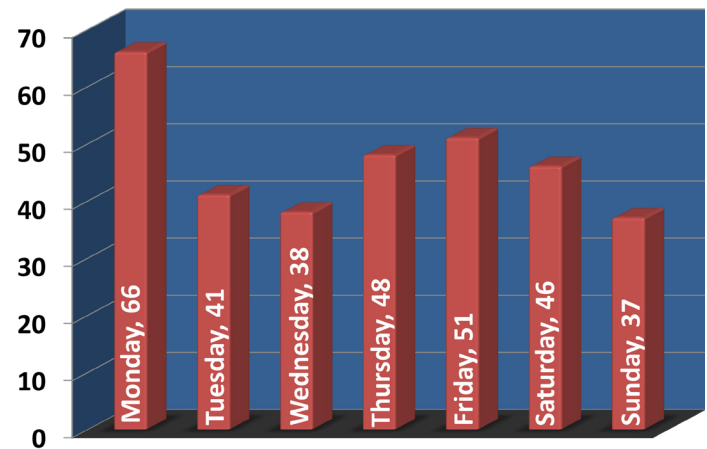
Response Percentages

Significant Responses

On 4/2/24 @ 07:25 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 4/16/24 @ 00:27 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 4/20/24 @ 17:20 hours, crews responded to a resident for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found one patient unconscious and one patient intoxicated. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported both patients to Kettering Health Franklin.

On 4/21/24 @ 11:10 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with a family member performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley South Hospital.

On 4/25/24 @ 20:16 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Franklin for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found the garage of a residence involved in fire with Franklin Fire on-scene. Crews assisted in extinguishing the fire. Additionally, crews secured utilities, investigated and extinguished hot spots throughout the residence. Crews then performed ventilation until released by command.

On 4/26/24 @ 00:47 hours, crews responded into Wayne Township for a reported gunshot wound. Upon arrival, crews found a patient with a peripheral gunshot wound. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley South Hospital.
