Station 24 Updates

In June, construction crews completed the flashing and fluid-applied air barriers. They completed the steel erector for the mezzanine floor decking and added a continuous plate above the Administration Area to allow for trusses to start. As roofing materials began arriving on-site, crews installed weather barriers for the Administration Areas. Additionally, crews completed interior wall framing in the Administration, Dormitory, and Day Room Areas. The Stair Tower and Storm Shelter slabs were placed, and plumbing and electrical rough-in began. Structural steel for the Training Tower stair installation began this month, as well. Finally, crews completed the installation of roof curbs and equipment rails for the HVAC system, and masonry workers began laying the brick veneer.



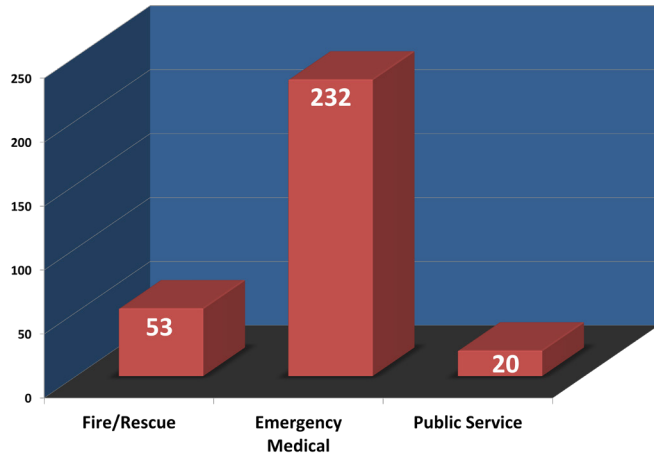

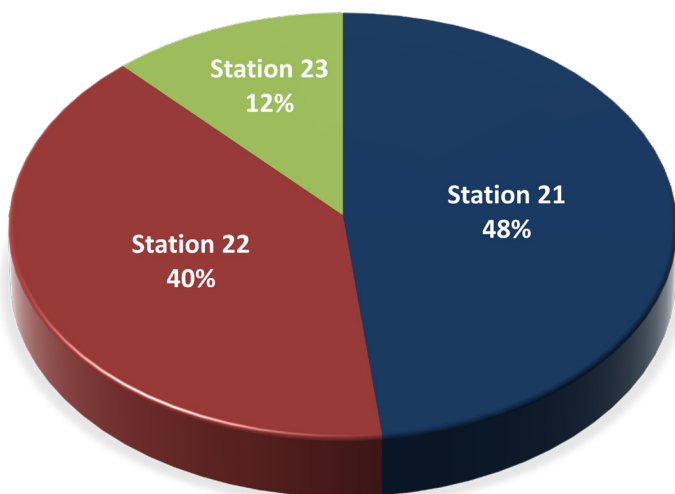
Alarms by Service Type

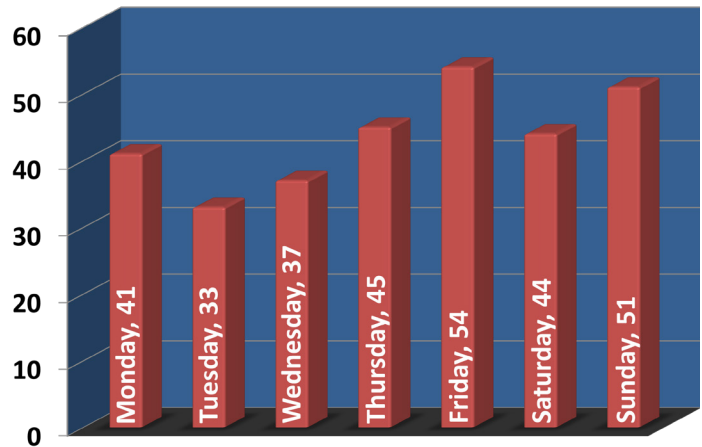
Response Percentages

Significant Responses

On 6/6/24 @ 17:00 hours, Warren County Technical Rescue Team (WCTRT) members Salas (Incident Commander), Moncrief, Becker, Buchholz, and Whitney responded to Hamilton Township for a reported motor vehicle accident. Upon arrival, crews found a dump truck crashed into a house. Crews extricated the driver and Hamilton Township EMS transported one patient. WCTRT stabilized the building using rescue shores.



On 6/10/24 at 20:20, crews responded to Bunnell Hill Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, they found two vehicles involved in a crash. Crews extricated one occupant and transported the patient to Kettering Health Main Campus. Crews secured the site of hazards and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 6/17/24 at 12:16, crews responded to a residence for a reported gunshot wound. Upon arrival, they found a patient with a gunshot wound to the leg. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Main Campus.

On 6/20/24 at 09:32, crews responded to North Main Street for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, they found a vehicle crashed into a building. Crews extricated the driver, who reported no injuries and refused medical evaluation. Crews requested an engineer from the city to inspect the building damage. Finding no additional hazards, crews released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 6/22/24 at 04:13, crews responded mutual aid into Hamilton Township for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, they found a residential building involved in fire. Crews staged as tactical reserve while Hamilton Township crews attacked the fire.

On 6/22/24 at 05:23 hours, while staging in Hamilton Township, crews responded mutual aid into Deerfield Township for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, they found a residential building involved in fire. Crews staged as tactical reserve until released by incident command.

On 6/30/24, at 20:49, crews responded to an apartment building for a reported outdoor equipment fire. Upon arrival, they found a pavilion equipped with gas grills showing smoke. Further investigation showed a contained fire under the countertop. Crews extinguished the fire using a pressurized water can. They removed the grills, performed overhaul, and checked for extension. Finding some extension, crews removed smoldering wood and sprayed the remaining areas of the structure. The estimated property damage due to the fire is \$2,000.
