Station 24 Updates

Construction crews completed structural steel for the mezzanine decking and Apparatus Bay door reinforcement plates in July. They also continued working on roof areas, completing the low roof over the Day Room and finished roof trusses over the administration area. Crews began installation of HVAC ductwork and ran overhead water lines. Masonry work continued during the month with the brick veneer completed at the Stair Tower and Storm Shelter. Masonry crews continued the brick veneer work on the west, east, and south side of the Apparatus Bay. Additionally, crews completed the electrical wall rough-in. By mid-month, fire suppression installation began with sprinkler fitters mobilized and mains ran through the Apparatus Bay and into the Mezzanine. Ending the month, crews installed wood blocking for cabinetry, poured concrete for the storm shelter, and completed the generator and dumpster pad.



At the Ohio Fire Chiefs' Association President's Banquet, Chief Agenbroad was sworn in as Vice-President of the Association. As Vice-President, his job is to assist the President and President-Elect and work closely with the Executive Director overseeing the finances and records of the Association. 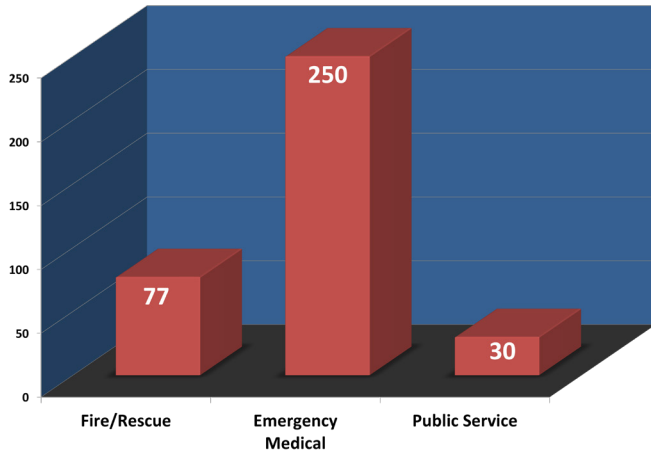

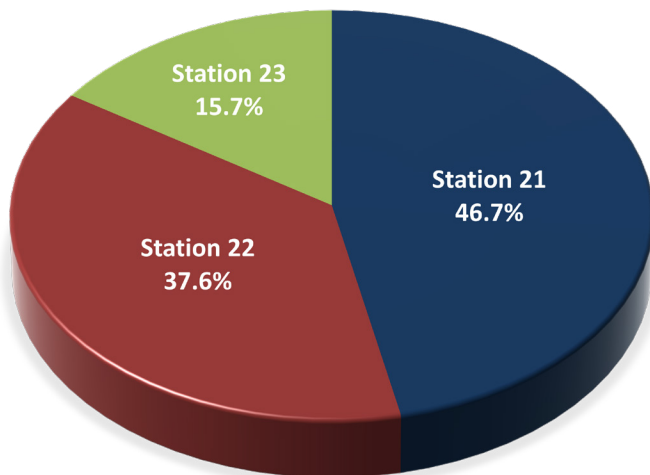
Alarms by Service Type

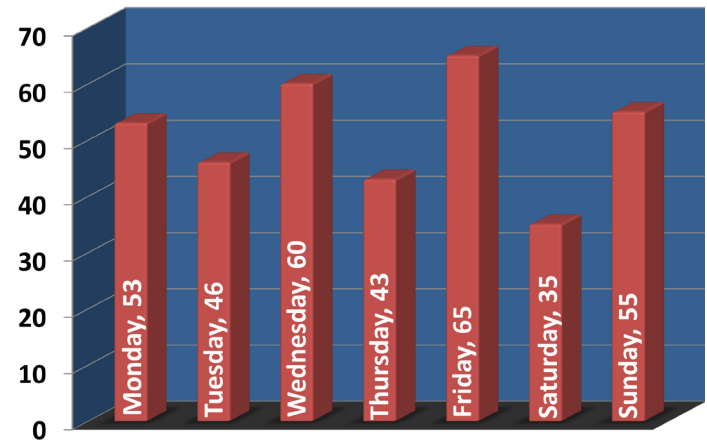
Response Percentages

Significant Responses

On 7/6/24 at 14:47 hours, crews responded to a recreation area for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in a postictal state. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Dayton Children's Hospital South Campus.

On 7/8/24 at 00:55 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported stab/gunshot wound/penetrating trauma. Upon arrival, crews found a patient with a gunshot wound. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Main Campus.



On 7/10/24 at 16:00 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Wayne Township for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residential building involved in fire with multiple companies working on suppression. Crews assisted in extinguishing the fire, searching for extension, and overhaul until released by command.



On 7/27/24 at 10:34 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Turtlecreek Township for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residence with heavy smoke showing. The fire was quickly extinguished, and crews performed a primary search of the second floor and checked for extension into the attic space. Crews then staged on-site until released by command.

On 7/27/24 at 17:54 hours, crews responded to an assisted living center for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with staff performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Miamisburg.

On 7/27/24 @ 25:51 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Lebanon for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a smoke-filled industrial building. Additional reports from interior crews stated the fire was kept in check by a sprinkler head. Crews assisted with smoke evacuation and fire suppression in a rooftop vent until released by command.

On 7/29/24 @ 15:27 hours, crews responded to I-75 Northbound for a reported passenger vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a single car involved in fire with the occupants evacuated. Crews blocked the scene and extinguished the fire using a front bumper line and foam. No injuries were reported during the incident. The estimated property loss due to the fire is \$22,500.

On 7/31/29 @ 06:10 hours, crews responded to Township Line Road and Route 42 for a reported motor vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a pickup truck and semi tractor-trailer involved in a crash, with the pickup off-road, into a ditch. Crews transported two patients to Atrium Medical Center. Ladder 22 shielded the scene while crews checked for hazards. After clearing the site of hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.
