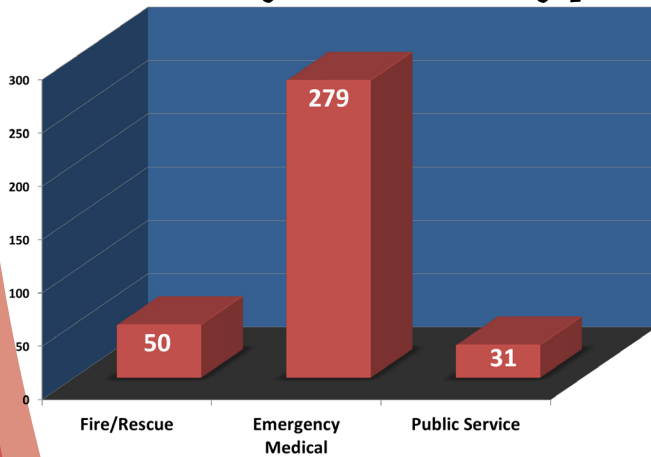




Total Alarms

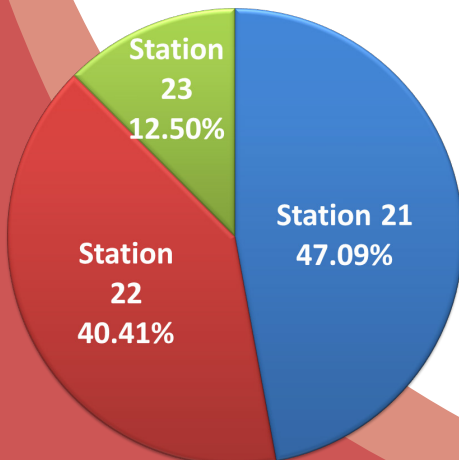
Alarms by Service Type

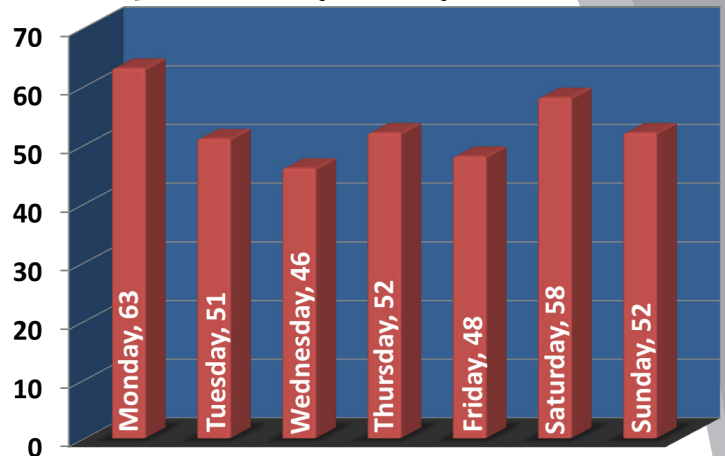
Response Percentages

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 1/7/22 @ 13:05 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 1/8/22 @ 03:54 hours, crews responded to State Route 73 and State Route 48 for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found the rear, inside dual tires of a semi-truck on fire. Crews used a fire extinguisher to put out the fire and a 1-3/4" hose for cooling. With no further hazards noted, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD. The estimated property damage from fire is \$1,000.

On 1/8/22 @ 19:30 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported fall. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with a family member performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Miamisburg.

On 1/11/22 @ 21:14 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley Hospital South.

On 1/22/22 @ 03:56 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

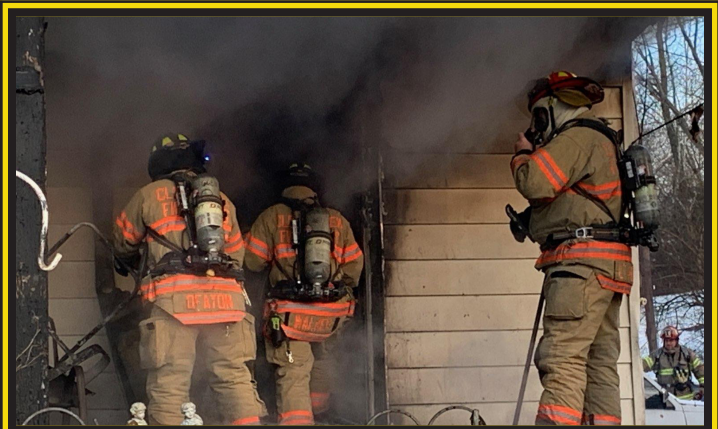
On 1/14/22 @ 12:05 hours, crews responded to a business for a reported high-angle rescue. Upon arrival, crews found a construction worker on the roof, disoriented and unable to stand without assistance due to a seizure. Using a Stokes Basket, crews applied a harness to the worker and secured the patient to the basket with webbing. Rescue crews secured the basket to Ladder 21 with a rope sling and anchor strap. After securing a tag line to the Stokes Basket, crews lowered the worker to the ground. Once transferred to Medic 21, the patient became alert and oriented. Medic crews assessed the patient and offered transport, which the patient refused.



On 1/17/22 @ 08:28 hours, crews responded to Mound Park Drive for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a single-story structure with a working fire and smoke showing from the exterior. There were no occupants in the building at the time of the fire. Crews located and extinguished the fire using a 1-3/4" hose line. Once extinguished, crews opened the garage doors and checked for extension. Finding no additional hazards, crews returned to service. Franklin Fire Department provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property damage from fire is \$11,000.



On 1/18/22 @ 16:41 hours, crews responded with a mutual aid engine from the City of Franklin to Wilson Drive for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a building showing heavy smoke and flames through the roof. Rescue 21 crews assisted the Interior Crew to find access to the second floor for fire attack. Command advised of an exterior staircase to the second floor. As Rescue 21 crews repositioned, Command ordered all crews to evacuate the building. Crews then extinguished the fire using two handlines. After extinguishing the fire, Rescue 21 crews assisted with overhaul.



On 1/29/22 @ 19:43 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported fall. Upon arrival, crews found a patient with a head injury from a fall. During assessment, the patient went into cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley Hospital South.


