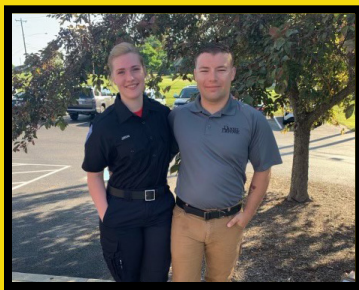
Meet your

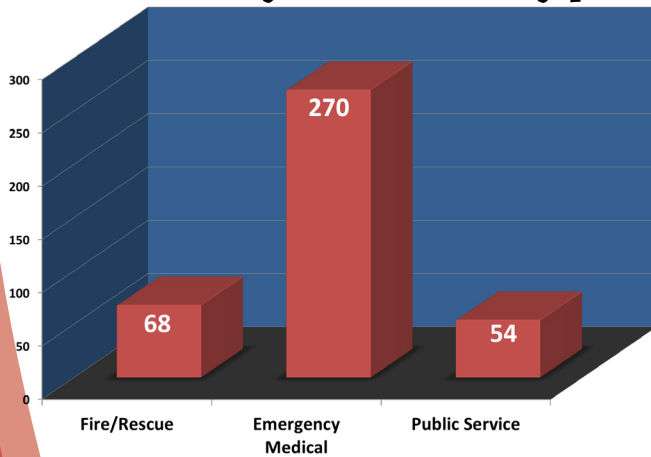




Total Alarms

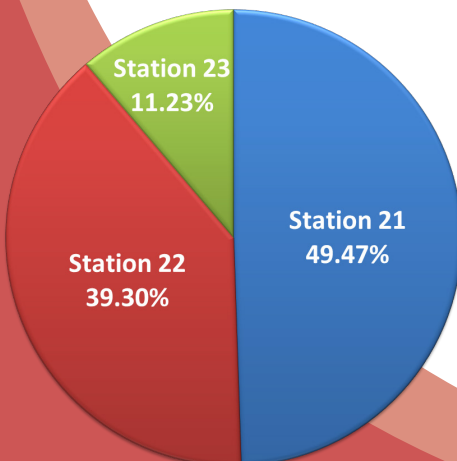
Alarms by Service Type

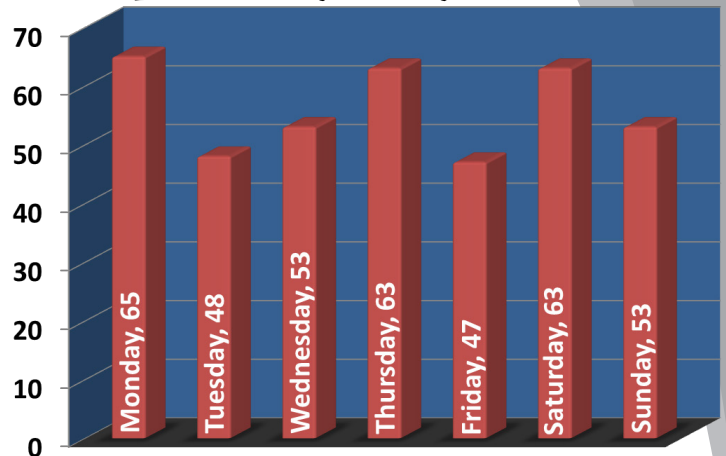
Response Percentages

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 10/2/22 @ 15:31 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call into Wayne Township for a reported vehicle accident with injury. Upon arrival, crews found a motorcycle involved in a single-vehicle accident and the rider showing multiple injuries. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to a landing zone for CareFlight. CareFlight personnel assumed patient care. The patient became unresponsive before being transferred into the CareFlight helicopter. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the patient to Wayne Township Fire Department.

On 10/3/22 @ 14:23 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 10/3/22 @ 20:16 hours, crews responded to Pioneer Boulevard for a report Building Fire. Upon arrival, crews found light smoke on the second floor. Many occupants evacuated the building, and crews assisted in evacuating the remaining residents. Further investigation found the source of the smoke came from burnt food. Crews performed ventilation and released the scene to building maintenance.

On 10/4/22 @ 16:09 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call in Lebanon for a reported unconscious/unresponsive person. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with bystanders performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 10/17/22 @ 01:46 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 10/20/22 @ 14:43 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported unconscious/unresponsive person. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with family performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 10/24/22 @ 02:54 hours, crews responded to State Route 122 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found one vehicle involved in an accident with all occupants out of the car. Additionally, crews found a utility pole down and power lines across the roadway. Crews secured the scene of hazards and transported one patient to Kettering Health Main Campus. Crews contacted Duke Energy to secure the power lines. After securing the site of hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD. Lebanon Fire Division provided mutual aid assistance.

On 10/28/22 @ 14:24 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 10/31/22 @ 09:37 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley Hospital South.

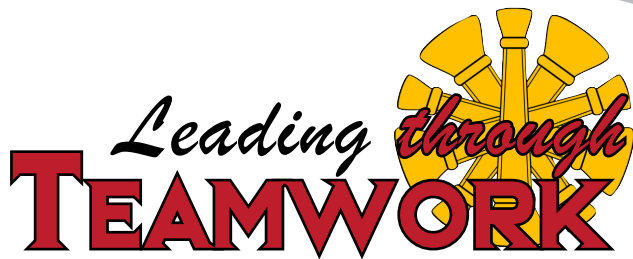
