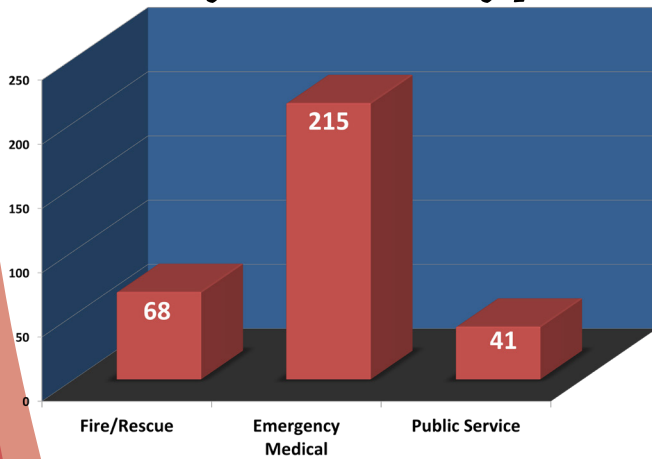




## Total Alarms

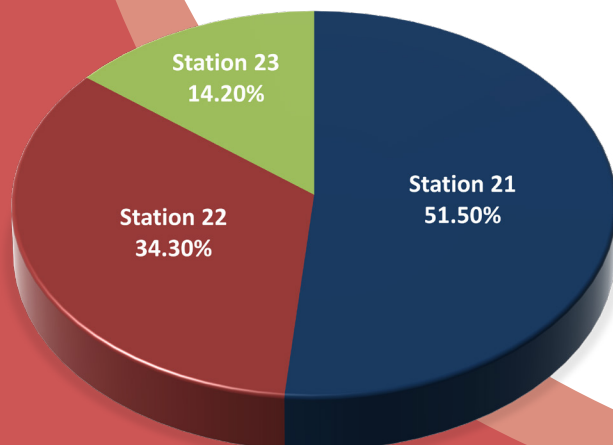
## Alarms by Service Type

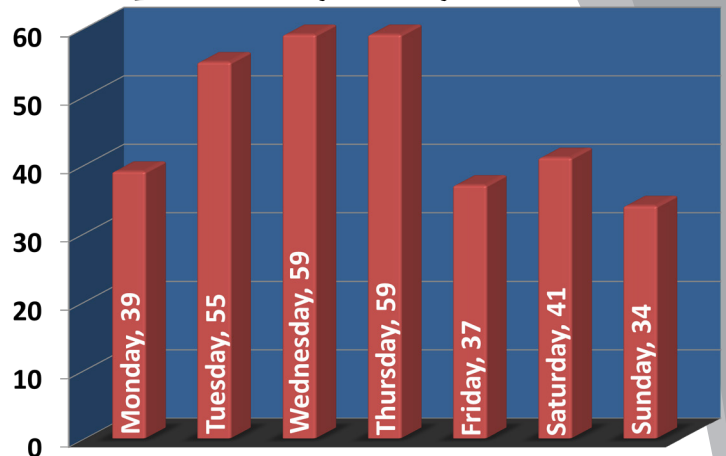
## Response Percentages

# SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 11/3/23 @ 00:12 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 11/4/23 @ 05:22 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Wayne Township for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with Wayne Township crews performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Wayne Township PD.

On 11/8/23 @ 19:35 hours, crews responded to Pinecone Lane for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residential building with nothing showing. Investigation showed a smoke haze in the basement with no heat or fire. Crews determined the source as a malfunctioning furnace motor. Crews isolated the breaker switch, turned off power to the furnace, and performed ventilation. Finding no additional hazards, crews advised residents to repair the furnace before restoring power. Miami Valley Fire District provided mutual aid assistance.

On 11/15/23 @ 05:32 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Franklin Township for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residence fully engulfed in fire with multiple units performing extinguishment. Command assigned crews to fire control and exposure protection. Crews assisted with extinguishing the fire until released by command.



On 11/21/23 @ 05:44, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 11/14/23 @ 18:15 hours, crews responded to North State Route 48 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a semi and pick-up truck involved in a crash with the semi off-road into a utility pole and the truck into a ditch. Additionally, crews found the utility pole damaged with wires down. Crews transported one patient to Kettering Health Miamisburg. Crews cleared the road of debris and contacted AES Ohio to disconnect power to the downed electric lines. After securing the wires, crews released the scene to Ohio State Patrol.

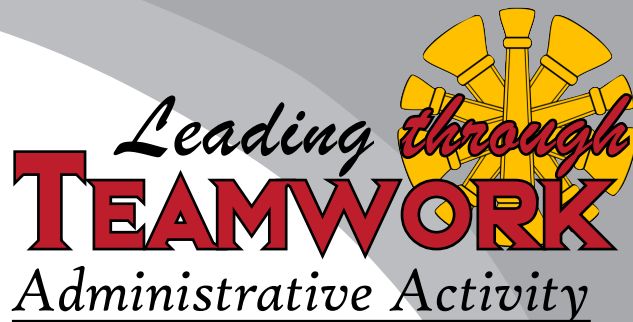
