




Total Alarms


Alarms by Service Type



Average Response Times



SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 12/2/22 @ 11:14 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call into Carlisle for a reported vehicle fire. Due to exposures, dispatch upgraded the call to a structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residential building showing smoke. Crews performed interior suppression activities and searched for extension. Finding no additional hazards, crews assisted with salvage and overhaul until released by command.




On 12/2/22 @ 19:17 hours, crews responded to Harlan Road for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residential building with nothing showing. Investigation revealed a heat signature and burnt wood smell in the attic. Crews extinguished the fire, checked for extension, and performed overhaul. The estimated property loss due to fire is \$25,000.



On 12/8/22 @ 22:58 hours, crews responded to a business for a reported power line down. Upon arrival, crews found a neon light arcing. Crews disconnected the power source and isolated and locked the breaker for repair.

On 12/13/22 @ 19:25 hours, crews responded to Pioneer Boulevard for a service call. Upon arrival, crews found Springboro PD and DEA Agents requesting access to a locked safe. Officers presented a warrant, and crews utilized a drill and 360° camera to inspect the safe contents while avoiding damage. Crews then used a power saw to access the back of the safe. With operations complete, crews relinquished custody of the safe to the DEA Agents and returned to service.



On 12/15/22 @ 20:34 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported unconscious person. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Main Campus.

On 12/25/22 @ 19:33 hours, crews responded to Springboro High School for a reported water problem. Upon arrival, crews found a domestic water line leak in front of the building and another leak in the sprinkler system. Crews used the shut-off valves to control the leaks and assisted school employees in moving items to prevent further damage.

On 12/26/22 @ 02:48 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call into Franklin for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a working fire in a residential structure. Crews assisted in fire attack and primary search until released by command.

On 12/28/22 @ 11:03 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 12/31/22 @ 16:48 hours, crews responded to a residence for reported heart problems. Upon arrival, crews found a recent heart-transplant patient showing signs of cardiovascular-hypotension. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Christ Hospital, Cincinnati, per the direction of Medical Control.


