Scott lives in Springboro with his wife and children. He enjoys spending his free time with his family. Scott also enjoys hunting and fishing when off-duty.

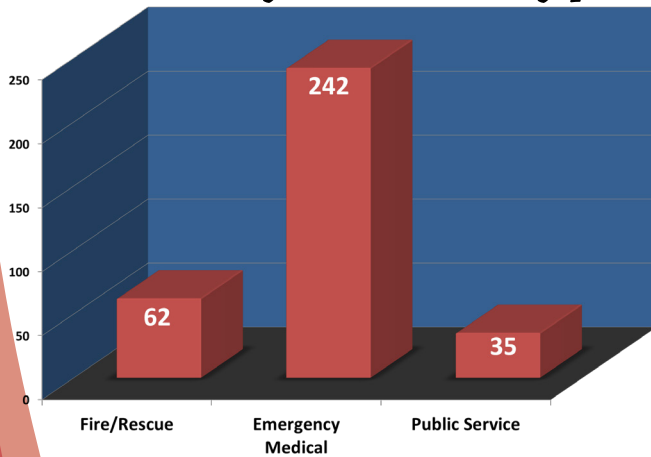




Total Alarms

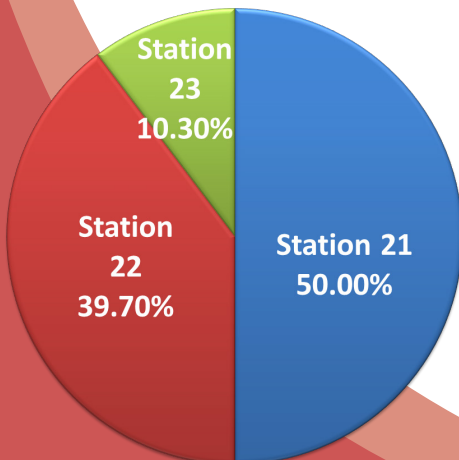
Alarms by Service Type

2021 = 06:18	2021 = 06:24

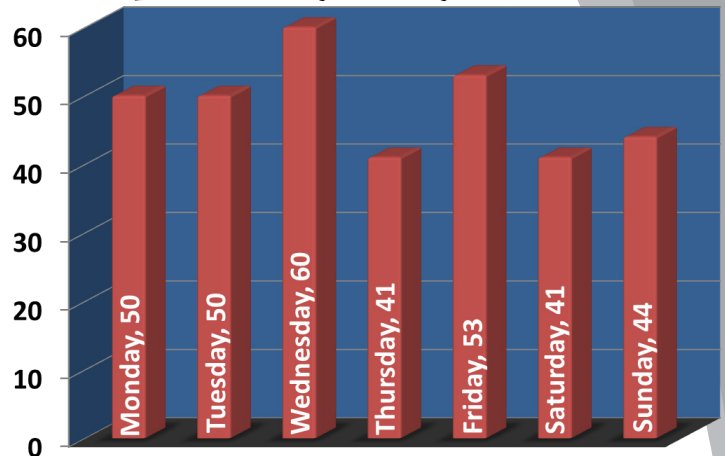
Response Percentages

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 2/1/22 @ 15:59 hours, crews responded to Springboro Woods Drive for a reported appliance fire. Upon arrival, crews found nothing showing. Further investigation showed no smoke but an odor of burnt plastic. Crews found an air fryer caught fire after a resident placed it on a hot stove burner. The resident extinguished the fire using water from the kitchen sink. Crews removed the air fryer from the building and checked for extension. Finding no additional hazards and no reported injuries, crews returned to service. The estimated property damage from fire is \$300.



On 2/7/22 @ 22:49 hours, crews responded to Clearcreek Franklin Road for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found nothing showing. However, the interior investigation showed smoke haze from a lit incense stick catching clothing on fire. Residents extinguished the fire with water before crew arrival. Crews removed the burnt clothes from the building and checked for extension. Finding no additional hazards, crews returned to service. The estimated property damage from fire is \$35.

On 2/9/22 @ 23:57 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Miamisburg.

On 2/13/22 @ 19:45 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported back pain/injury. While responding, Warren County Dispatch upgraded the call to a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with Springboro PD performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 2/18/22 @ 18:40 hours, crews responded to Central Avenue and Sharts Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles with damage involved in a head-on collision. Crews secured the scene and transported one patient to Children's Dayton South. Joint Emergency Medical Services (JEMS) transported three additional patients. Rescue 21 crews supplied scene lighting, traffic control, and hazard mitigation. Once secure, crews released the scene to Springboro PD. The City of Franklin and JEMS provided mutual aid assistance.



On 2/19/22 @ 17:06 hours, crews responded to Settlers Walk for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a single-family residence with smoke coming from an open garage door. Springboro Police and neighbors applied water using a garden hose. Crews entered the garage and found two trash cans showing smoke but no active fire. Crews removed the trash cans and applied water. Thermal imaging confirmed no extension into the garage. Crews performed ventilation, salvage, and overhaul. Washington Township provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property damage from fire is \$600.



On 2/2/22 @ 14:00 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported unconscious/unresponsive person. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.
