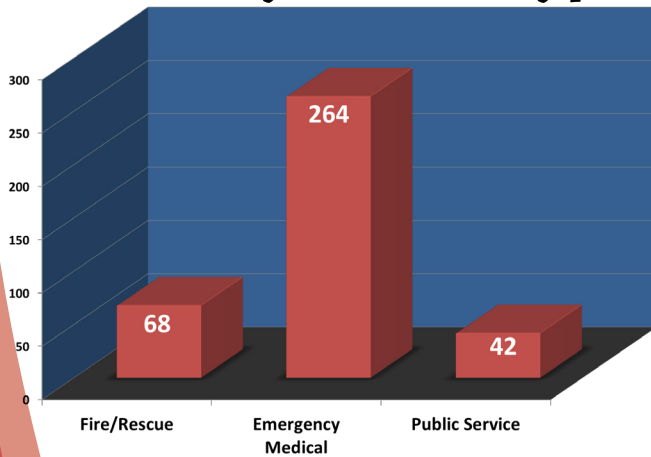

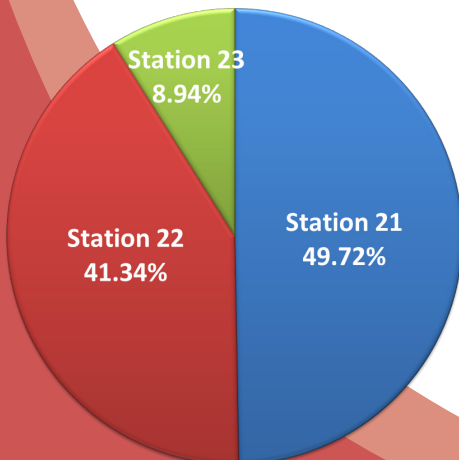
Alarms by Service Type

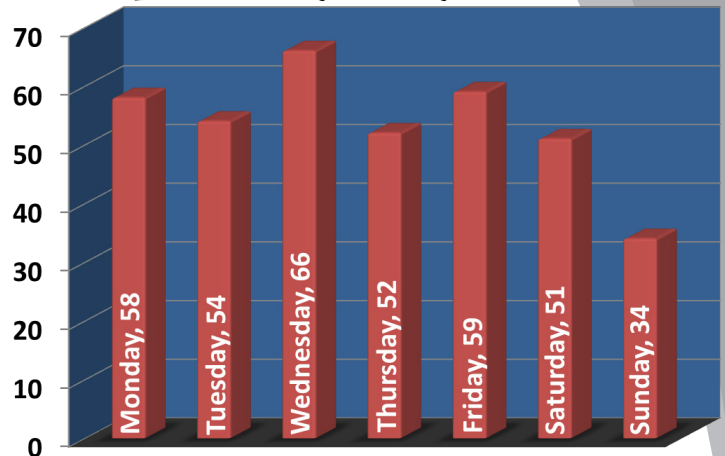
Response Percentages

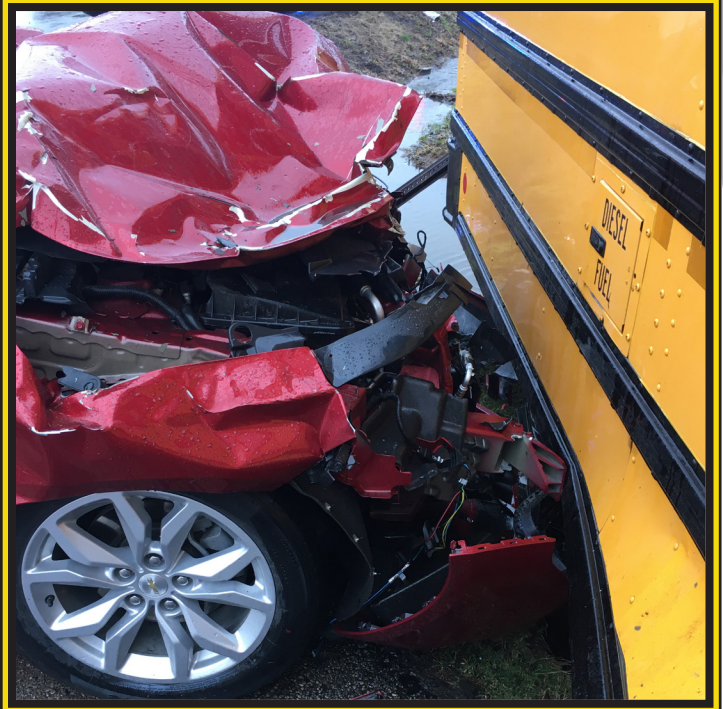

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 3/2/22 @ 18:34 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with a family member performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and to Atrium Medical Center.

On 3/4/22 @ 06:51 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with assisted living staff performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 3/7/22 @ 08:31 hours, crews responded to Crestview Avenue for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a school bus and a car involved in a crash, with both vehicles sustaining damage. Crews transported three patients with minor injuries to Atrium Medical center. No school bus passengers reported injuries. After stabilizing the vehicles and securing the scene of hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 3/7/22 @ 09:09 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 3/9/22 @ 07:17 hours, crews responded to South Main street for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles involved in a crash. Both cars sustained damage, with one patient entrapped. Firefighters extricated the trapped occupant out of the car and transported one patient to Kettering Health Franklin with minor injuries, while a mutual aid medic transported a second patient. Crews stabilized the vehicles and secured the scene of hazards. Joint Emergency Medical Services provided mutual aid assistance.

On 3/16/22 @ 13:10 hours, crews responded to Pleasant Valley Drive for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found one vehicle on fire with all occupants outside the car and no reported injuries. Crews stretched one handline to extinguish the fire, which started in the engine and spread to the passenger compartment. After securing the site of hazards, firefighters released the scene to Springboro PD. The estimated property loss due to fire is \$17,000.



On 3/26/22 @ 00:42 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported fall. While en route, dispatch updated the call to a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 3/28/22 @ 10:00 hours, crews responded to a highway for a reported gunshot. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to the Ohio State Patrol.

On 3/28/22 @ 13:44 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported unconscious/unresponsive person. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 3/28/22 @ 14:19 hours, crews responded to Cobblestone Lane for a reported gas leak. Upon arrival, crews noted the smell of natural gas from a gas line struck by an underground bore machine. Due to the amount of gas leaking and proximity to residential buildings, crews evacuated occupants of nearby houses. Finding no additional hazards and receiving confirmation of timely repair from CenterPoint Energy, crews returned to service. At 15:38 hours, crews returned to the scene at the request of CenterPoint Energy due to complications with the gas line repair. Upon return, crews evacuated additional residents due to natural gas detection inside the buildings. Engine 22 and Battalion 21 blocked access to the area while CenterPoint Energy workers stopped the leak and proceeded with repairs. Once workers secured the leak and crews confirmed the houses were clear of natural gas, residents could safely reenter their homes. With all hazards secure, crews released the scene to CenterPoint Energy to finish repairs.

On 3/27/22 @ 09:48 hours, crews responded to Locust Drive for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a structure with smoke showing from the roof and eaves. All occupants evacuated the building, and there were no reported injuries. Rescue crews pulled a handline through the front door and found light haze. Further investigation revealed a fire in the garage. Crews extinguished the fire and checked for extension. Finding no fire extension, crews performed ventilation and remained on-scene to support investigation efforts. Turtlecreek Township and the City of Franklin provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property damage from fire is \$15,000.



On 3/31/22 @ 06:27 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 3/31/22 @ 08:12 hours, crews responded to a residential street for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a vehicle into a ditch with no visible damage. Upon investigation, crews found one patient unresponsive. Crews stabilized the vehicle and extricated the patient, who was in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley Hospital South. Finding no additional hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.
