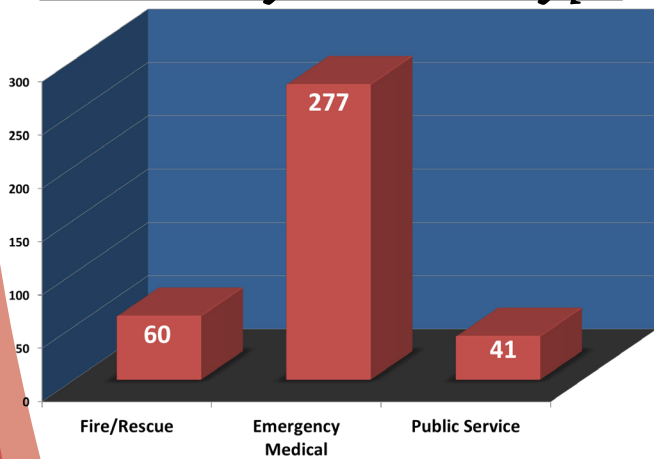




Total Alarms

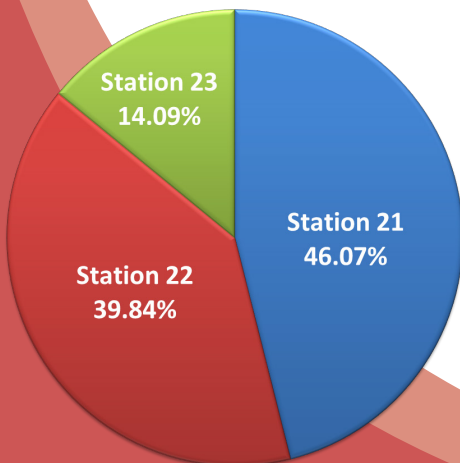
Alarms by Service Type

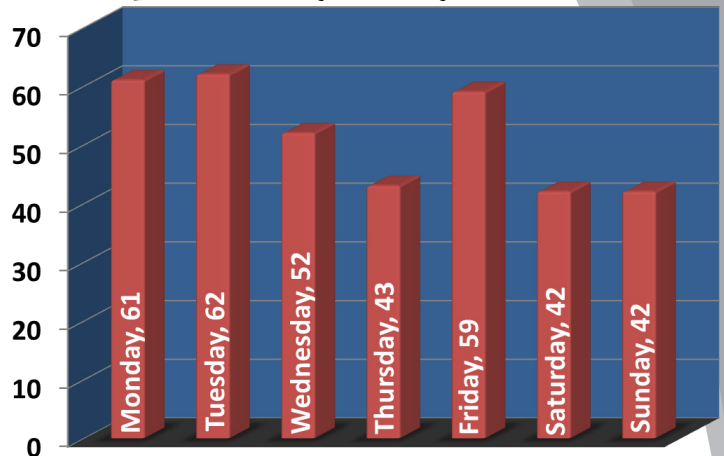
Response Percentages

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 5/4/22 @ 00:20 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported choking. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 5/6/22 @ 19:42 hours, crews responded to a residence for reported breathing problems. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 5/8/22 @ 01:10 hours, crews responded to Utica Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a pickup truck into a utility pole with power lines down. The driver was out of the vehicle and reported no injuries. Medic 23 and Clearcreek PD took position to protect the scene. Duke energy arrived on scene to repair the damaged utilities. After securing the scene of hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 5/11/22 @ 21:26 hours, crews responded to Nutmeg Square for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residential structure with light smoke showing. Investigation showed smoldering plastic in an oven. The building occupant extinguished the fire prior to crew arrival. Crews checked for additional hazards and performed ventilation. The City of Franklin provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated damage due to fire is \$300.

On 5/14/22 @ 03:41 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Washington Township.

On 5/14/22 @ 12:42 hours, crews responded to a church for a reported seizure. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with Springboro PD performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Main Campus.

On 5/14/22 @ 13:10 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported traumatic injury. Upon arrival, crews found a patient with a hand stuck in a tree trimmer. Crews released the patient's hand and removed the patient's work glove. Crews then checked for injury and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 5/14/22 @ 20:38 hours, crews responded to State Route 48 for a reported passenger vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a pick-up truck showing fire in the engine compartment with extension into the passenger compartment. All occupants evacuated the truck and reported no injuries. Crews extinguished the fire using a handline. Finding no additional hazards, crews cleared the scene. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$5,000.



On 5/15/22 @ 07:38 hours, crews responded to State Route 48 for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a farm tractor with fire in the engine compartment. Crews extinguished the fire using a handline and tank water. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$5,000.



On 5/16/22 @ 07:23 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported unconscious/unresponsive person. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with CPR in progress. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 5/16/22 @ 08:02 hours, crews responded to Brookfield Court for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residential building with light smoke showing in the basement. Investigation showed that a shorted electrical wire in the water heater burned insulation behind its panel. Crews checked for additional hazards and cut the power supply to the water heater. The estimated damage from fire is \$1,500.

On 5/20/22 @ 12:41 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 5/23/22 @ 11:10 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 5/28/22 @ 05:40 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 5/26/22 @ 12:17 hours, crews responded to Red Lion Five Points Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crew found a single vehicle off the roadway with the driver entrapped. Crews extricated the driver and transported one patient to Kettering health Main Campus.
