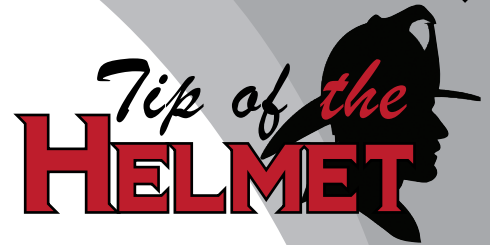

On 6/13/22, our community experienced severe storms that left thousands of residents and businesses without power. Among those without power was a family with a child in need of oxygen. Running low on oxygen bottles and out of propane to run the generator for the oxygen concentrator, the family called for EMS assistance. Upon arrival, Firefighter/Paramedic (FF/PM) Wade Easterling assessed the situation. He assisted the family in locating enough propane to run the generator for the night, thus, saving the family from a costly hospital visit. As stated by Lieutenant Eric Henry, the easiest path would have been to load the child on a stretcher for transport, "but the easiest path, as we all know, isn't always the best path. FF/PM Easterling obviously did not do this for recognition. He just wanted to do the right thing." Additionally, Chief Agenbroad thanks Wade for "going above and beyond by putting our mission and core values into action by taking such great care of this family."

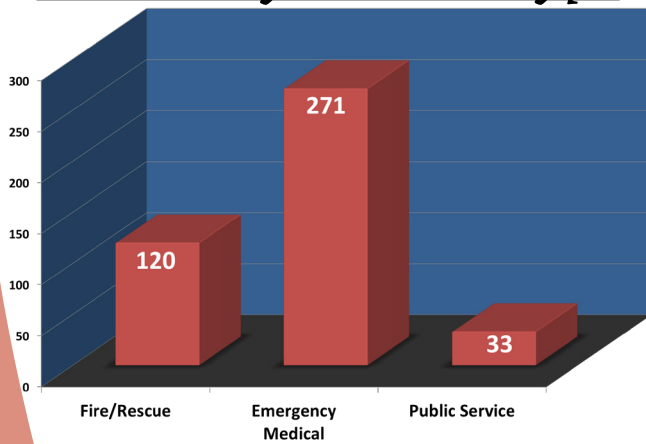




Total Alarms

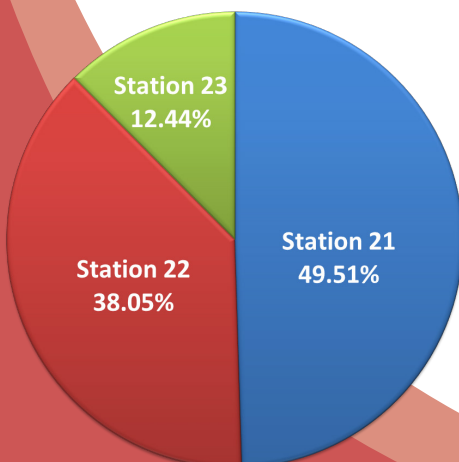
Alarms by Service Type

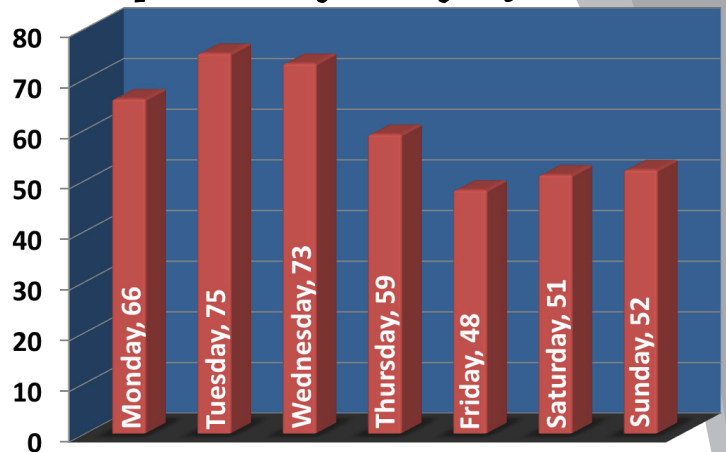
Response Percentages

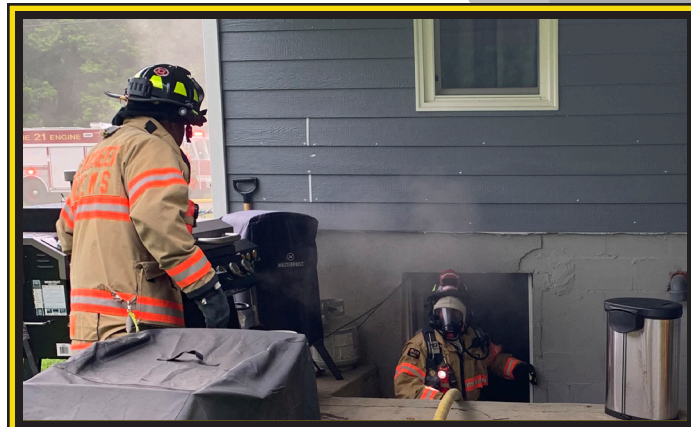
SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 6/1/22 @ 17:08 hours, crews responded to a residence for a report non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 6/2/22 @ 16:02 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported unknown medical problem. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with Springboro PD administering CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transferred care to Joint Emergency Medical Services for transport.

On 6/3/22 @ 06:12 hours, crews responded to a residence for reported breathing problems. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in respiratory arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 6/5/22 @ 18:40 hours, crews responded to Stone Ridge Drive for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residential building with nothing showing. Investigation showed smoke haze and heat, but no visible fire, coming from an oven vent. Crews checked for heat signatures and extension. Finding no additional hazards, crews performed ventilation.



On 6/8/22 @ 17:58 hours, crews responded to East State Route 73 for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residential structure with light smoke showing from the basement, and all occupants evacuated. After gaining entry, crews encountered heavy smoke and fire. Crews extinguished the fire using a handline and checked for extension. Finding no additional hazards, crews performed ventilation. Washington Township provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property damage from the fire is \$7,000.



On 6/12/22 @ 17:48 hours, crews responded to Utica Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a car into a telephone pole with one occupant entrapped. Crews extricated the occupant and transported one patient to Kettering Health Main Campus. After securing the scene of hazards, crews contacted Duke Energy and released the scene to Clearcreek PD. Turtlecreek Township provided mutual aid assistance.



On 6/5/22 @ 11:23 hours, crews responded to Clearcreek-Franklin Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found three cars involved in a crash. Medic 21 crews transported one patient to Miami Valley Hospital Austin Boulevard Emergency Center, and Medic 22 crews transported one patient to Kettering Health Miamisburg. Finding no additional hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 6/16/22 @ 11:35 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call into Franklin Township for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found heavy fire on the front porch of a residential building. Investigation revealed heavy smoke on all sides of the roof line. Engine 23 and Rescue 21 crews advanced to the second floor for fire attack and noted holes in the floor and ceiling. Crews extinguished the located fire and exited the building due to safety issues. Crews assisted with defensive operations and clean-up until released by command.



On 6/18/22 @ 19:18 hours, crews responded to Utica Road and Old State Route 122 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles showing damage. Engine 22 crews checked for hazards and provided traffic control. Medic crews transported two patients to Atrium Medical Center. Finding no additional hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 6/20/22 @ 13:47 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call into the City of Franklin for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found heavy fire on the first floor of a residential building. Rescue 21 crews used handlines to assist in fire control, making entry and proceeding to the second floor to extinguish the additional fire. Crews performed firefighting as needed throughout the incident until released by command.
