Congratulations to Unit 2 for achieving the best average time in this year's training competition for the second year in a row, with an overall average time of 5:33 (a 12-second improvement over last year). This yearly training is a way to emphasize firefighter fitness and competencies with a timed obstacle course and have some fun in the process. This year's test involves nine stations. Firefighters perform tasks such as climbing an extension ladder, carrying a hose line, carrying two 50-pound dumbbells, dragging a 185-pound manikin, and other core competencies. The unit with the best average time receives lunch, and the individual with the best time receives bragging rights. The individual firefighter with the best time this year is, once again, Jed Fernbaugh, from Unit 3 at Station 21, completing the course in a lightning-fast 3:37 (34-seconds faster than last year). Way to go, Jed!

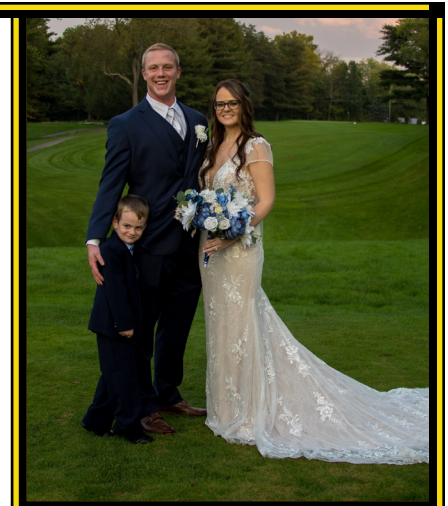

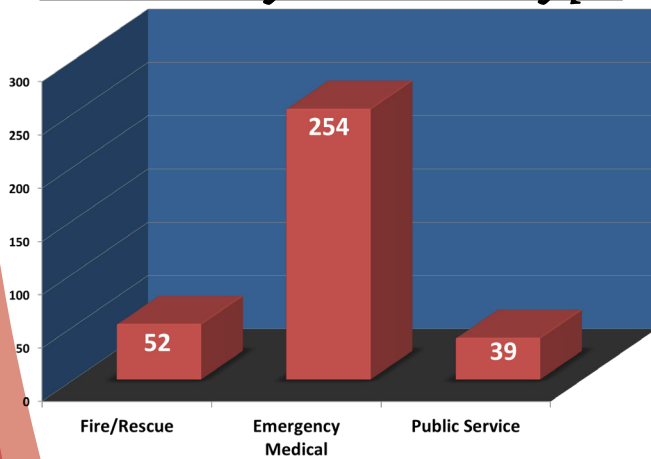




Total Alarms

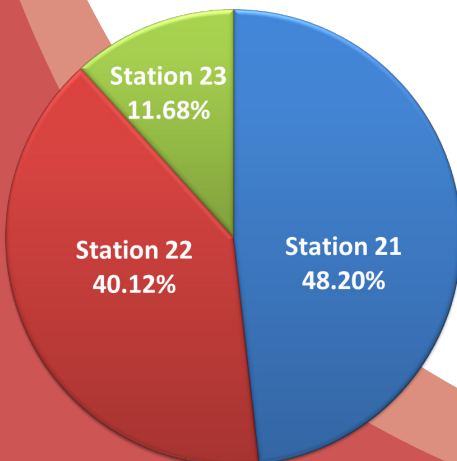
Alarms by Service Type

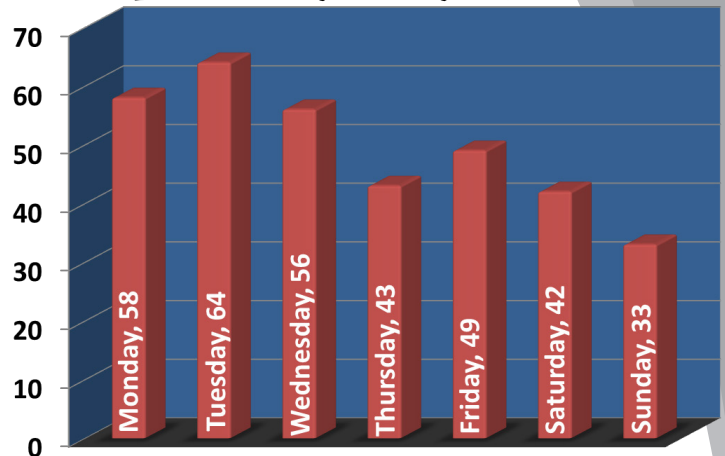
Response Percentages

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 8/1/22 @ 13:01 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest, with nursing staff performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 8/1/22 @ 13:36 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest, with nursing staff performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Miamisburg.

On 8/4/22 @ 17:44 hours, crews responded to South Main Street for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a patient struck by a pick-up truck. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Children's Dayton.



On 8/10/22 @ 19:21 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call into Franklin for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles in a crash, with one vehicle on its side and three occupants entrapped, with Franklin Rescue Crews stabilizing the car. Rescue 21 assisted with shielding the scene and extrication.



On 8/5/22 @ 17:56 hours, crews responded to I-75 Northbound for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two SUVs involved in a crash, with one rolled over and on its top. All occupants evacuated the cars. Crews stabilized the vehicles and transported one patient to Kettering Health Miamisburg. Crews secured the site of hazards and released the scene to Ohio State Patrol.



On 8/7/22 @ 20:25 hours, crews responded to State Route 73 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a single vehicle off the roadway that rolled over, and the driver ejected. Medic crews transported one patient to Kettering Health Main Campus. After securing the site of hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 8/9/22 @ 04:53 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 8/24/22 @ 20:56 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call into Franklin for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residence with heavy fire involvement. Rescue 21 crews made an interior attack and found heavy fire in the attic. Command ordered the building evacuated and used deck guns to control the fire. Crews performed overhaul and extinguished hot spots before being released by Command.



On 8/27/22 @ 10:11 hours, crews responded to a mutual aid call into Washington Township for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a multi-family apartment complex with the fire extinguished and crews performing salvage and overhaul. Station 22 crews checked for extension and extinguished hot spots.

On 8/29/22 @ 12:31 hours, crews responded to State Route 48 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a vehicle in a ditch with damage to the top and passenger side, with one person entrapped. Crews extricated the occupant and transported one patient to Atrium Medical Center. Crews secured the site and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 8/30/22 @ 20:52 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 8/31/22 @ 15:56 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient experiencing chest pains. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Miamisburg.

On 8/17/22 @ 06:56 hours, crews responded to South Main Street for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a garbage truck with smoke showing from the front dump container. Crews moved the truck to a secure location in the rear lot of Dennis Elementary to dump the load and found a small fire in the trash load. Using a handline, crews extinguished the fire and notified Springboro Schools.



On 8/20/22 @ 15:58 hours, crews responded to Greenwood Lane for a reported lightning strike. Upon arrival, crews found fire alarms sounding on the third floor of a hotel with no smoke or fire showing. Investigation showed structural damage to the roof. Crews checked for extension and performed overhaul. Finding no additional hazards, crews covered the strike area and released the scene to hotel maintenance. The estimated damage due to the lightning strike is \$3,000. The City of Franklin provided mutual aid assistance.
