



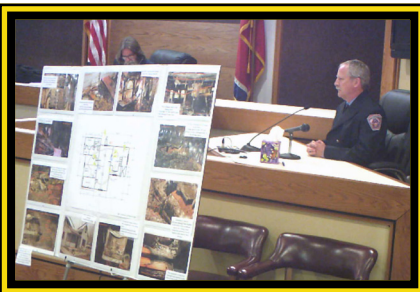

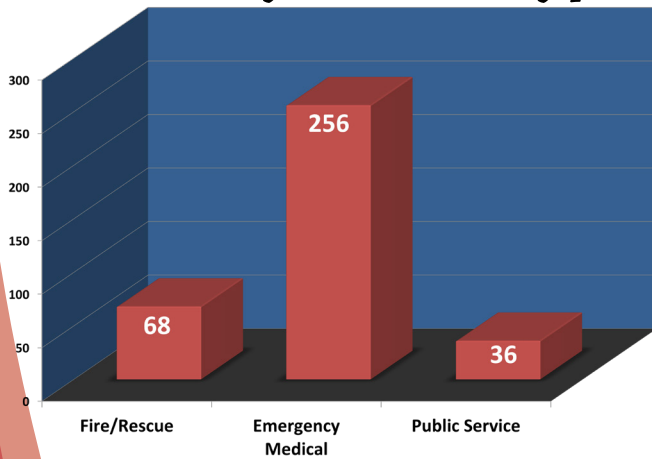




Total Alarms

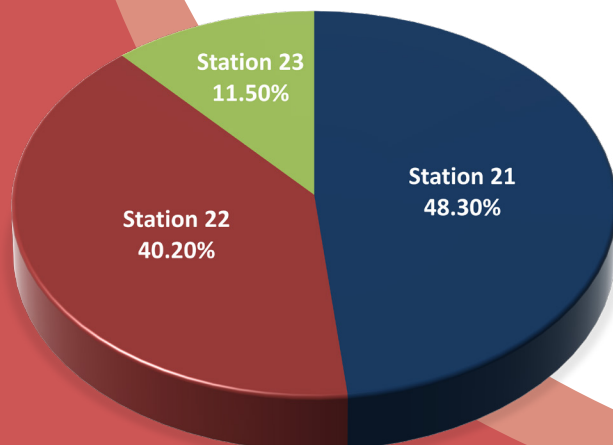
Alarms by Service Type

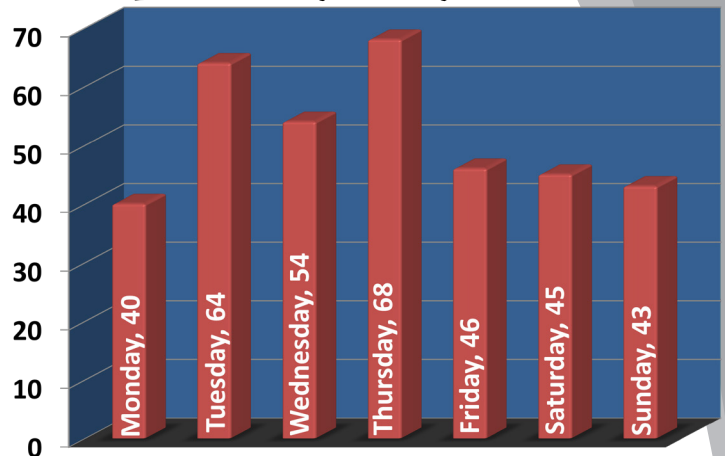
Response Percentages

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 8/1/23 @ 06:10 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported stroke. Upon arrival, crews found a patient exhibiting stroke symptoms. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley Hospital Main Campus.

On 8/2/23 @ 10:10 hours, crews responded to Bunnell Hill Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a pickup truck into a tree with all occupants evacuated. Crews stabilized the vehicle and assessed the occupants. Crews transported one patient to Miami Valley Hospital Main Campus. Crews secured the site of hazards and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 8/2/23 @ 18:58 hours, crews responded to mutual aid into Waynesville for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Waynesville PD.

On 8/3/23 @ 07:55 hours, crews responded to South Main Street for a reported chemical spill/leak. Upon arrival, crews found a garbage truck with a vapor cloud emanating from the hopper. The driver informed crews that he emptied a trash can with containers of an unknown substance prior to the chemical reaction. Investigation showed muriatic acid mixed with water to create the vapor. Crews removed the containers and covered the remaining product with water to dissipate in the hopper. After securing the site of hazards, crews released the chemicals to the trash company for proper disposal.

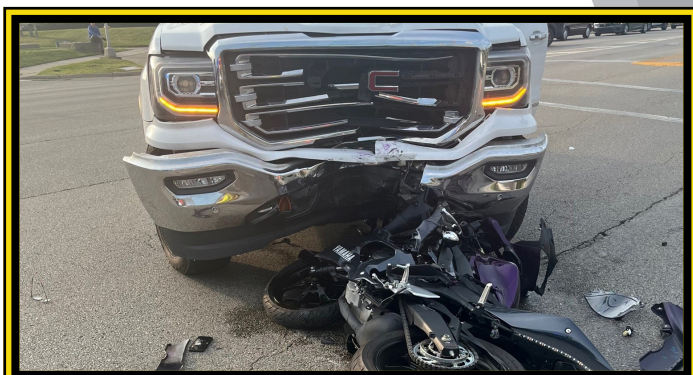
On 8/8/23 @ 12:45 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 8/15/23 @ 16:54 hours, crews responded to Remick Boulevard for a reported passenger vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a golf cart that caught fire and was extinguished using a fire extinguisher. Investigation showed a battery under the seat overheated, causing the fire. Crews disconnected all battery terminals and checked for heat signatures. The estimated property loss due to fire is \$500.

On 8/24/23 @ 07:30 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 8/27/23 @ 03:29 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported gunshot wound. Upon arrival crews found a patient with a gunshot wound. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Main Campus.

On 8/29/23 @ 23:38 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with a family member performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.



On 8/24/23 @ 18:45 hours, crews responded to North Main Street and West Lytle Five Points Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a motorcycle under the front end of a truck with the rider down in the roadway. Crews transported one patient to Kettering Health Main Campus. Investigation revealed that the truck was leaking coolant. Crews applied drying agent to the fluid. Finding no additional hazards, crews released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 8/31/23 @ 15:44 hours, crews responded to Eyler Drive and West Lower Springboro Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival crews found an SUV crashed into a Springboro PD cruiser. Crews extricated one vehicle occupant and transported one patient to Kettering Main Campus and another to Kettering Health Washington Township. Crews secured the site of hazards and released the scene to Springboro PD.
